Polio Decreasing In Great Britain

London - (Science Service)-Polio, like other killer diseases, before it may be approaching the vanishing point in Britain, as in the U.S.

There was a remarkable decline in its prevalence last year. For the first time in 14 years, the number of cases reported was below 1,000. They totaled 516, with 34 deaths. This compared with 1,328 cases and 86 deaths the year before. In 1958 there were 2,315 cases with 147 deaths, while ten years ago, in 1950, cases totaled 7,760, with 755 deaths.

Ministry of health and medical research council experts concede that much of the improvement can be attributed to the success of the Salk vaccination campaign. Further improvement may be looked for in the future because, from the beginning of 1961, vaccination is available to those more than 40 years of age, and the killed injected vaccine may be later supplemented by the live oral one.
