

Sermons, Activities Listed For Presbyterian Churches

A - THE GOSPEL IS GOD'S POWER UNTO SALVATION.
"For I am not ashamed of the gospel: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth..." Romans 1:16.
