Lowell Red Devils B School Champs

Bend — (UPI) — Lowell's Red Devils have their first Oregon high school class B basketball championship.

Lowell won its B School title Saturday night by beating Ione 52-49 on a three-point play by little Larry Dixon in the final six seconds.

Dixon, a 5-6 guard, hit a 25-foot field goal and then made a foul shot on the same play.

The final game, watched by an estimated 2,000 fans who topped the three-day, eight-team tournament attendance to an estimated 6,700, was close all the way.

Ione held a 12-11 first quarter lead and Lowell was on top at 27-25 and 37-36 at the end of the half and third quarter.

Al McDaniel of Lowell wound up with 26 points and John Swanson of Ione, who finished as the tournament's top scorer with 77 points, had 27.

Seattle university and the University of Oregon have been picked for the two large berths in the NCAA western regional basketball playoffs, which get underway Wednesday night at Portland, Ore.

R. S. (Spec) Keene, athletic director at Oregon State and chairman of the western selection committee, announced the selection Sunday after conferring by telephone with the other four members of the committee.

Keene, who did not vote, said the picks were unanimous. Voting were basketball coaches John Bennington, St. Louis; Hoyt Brawner, Denver; Polk Robison, Texas Tech, and Johnny Wooden of UCLA.
