New York—(UPI)—Although essentially bullish about the market over the months ahead, Shields & Co. is distressed by "the mess of flotam and jetsam which temporarily seems to be riding the crest."

The brokerage house says it is upset by the scramble for quick capital gain by people who are blind to the degree of risk they are taking and who are ill-informed as to the nature of the securities they are purchasing.

Alan C. Poole of Hemphill, Noyes & Co. says his current preferences in the engineering and construction field are Stone & Webster, Raymond International, George A. Fuller, Morris-Knudsen, Chain Belt and Worthington—in that order.

Bache & Co. feels Union Oil of California has finally found the road to higher profits, making the stock an interesting intermediate and longer-term speculation. Bache also recommends maintenance of commitments in Emory Air Freight but profit taking for short-term accounts in Celotex and United Air Lines.

Joseph E. Granville, the E. F. Hutton & Co. analyst, says Sperry Rand appears to be in a more commanding position for further advance than at any time in the past four years. He says the stock has moved up to a position where all the tops of the past six years could be bettered and this advance would be expected to result in a rather impressive rise.

Shearson, Hamill & Co. says recent price increases have enhanced the earnings prospects of Beech-Nut Life Savers and, since the dividend has been increased in each of the past five years, a further liberalization is likely if earnings materialize as expected.

Callahan Man High Bidder For Timber

Yreka-E. J. Hjertager, Callahan, Calif., has been awarded 1,900,000 board feet of timber in the Shadow Creek unit of the Salmon River Working circle, according to an announcement by Supervisor Charles A. Yates of the Klamath national forest.

Total bid value for the 125,000 feet of pine and 1,775,000 feet of Douglas fir was \$27,975. Basil D. Wild, Greenview, also submitted a bid.

No bids were received for this unit when it was first offered for sale in December, 1960.

District Ranger A. R. Groncki and Richard C. Nute, his timber management assistant, will be responsible for proper administration of the sale.
