**State's Public Colleges Receive Gifts, Grants Totalling \$18 Million**

Eugene Gifts and grants to Oregon's public colleges during the current biennium have already totaled more than 18 million dollars. Chancellor John R. Richards announced to the State Board of Higher Education meeting in Eugene this week.

Commenting that although it is difficult to measure excellence in dollars, Richards said, "It is, nevertheless, a very real tribute to our distinguished faculties that Oregon research projects have been so generously supported by the federal government and by private foundations and donors throughout the nation."

Most research grants, he explained, are awarded to the professor himself on the basis of his professional reputation to further a project which he has already initiated.

**Mainly Federal**

Richards reported that gifts and grants to the nine state supported colleges since July 1, 1959, amount to \$18,036,250. Of this, more than 14 million came from federal sources, the remainder from foundations and private donors.

Richards added that the 18 million dollar figure does not include grants from the National Institute of Health for establishment of a primate center connected with the

Medical Research foundation. Federal commitments for the center, now under construction near Portland, are estimated at around 10 million dollar between now and 1970.

Of the receipts listed by Richards nearly nine-and-a-half million were in the form of grants for specified projects in basic and applied research, covering a wide variety of programs from basic research in the sciences and medicine to social studies, forestry problems and agricultural research.

**Specialized Training**

Grants for institutes total \$3,627,422. Much of this will be used to provide programs in specialized training for teachers in foreign languages and in science.

Construction grants to house research or other specialized facilities amount to \$2,200,000 while \$893,000 was received for scholarships and fellowships. Pioneering research in television instruction was supported in the amount of \$368,000; \$537,000 was earmarked for overseas training grants, and projects for the advancement of teaching brought in \$342,360. Donations of books, supplies and equipment are valued at \$311,000.

Among the colleges, the University of Oregon Medical school proved the biggest fund-getter with donations totalling \$5,932,125. In close second and third place are Oregon State university with \$3,311,238 in gifts and grants, and the University of Oregon with \$5,252,811. Other state system colleges received the following amounts: University of Oregon Dental school, \$409,488; the General Extension Division, mostly for educational television, \$515,507; Portland State, \$208,206; Oregon College of Education, \$184,532; Eastern Oregon, \$59,527; Southern Oregon, \$45,868; Oregon Technical Institute, \$14,740. The sum of \$122,115 was received by the state board.
