WILLIAM HARRY MYERS - Funeral services for William Harry Myers, route 3, box 122, Medford, who died Thursday, will be held Saturday at 10 a.m. at the Chapel in the Trees in Siskiyou Memorial park. The Rev. Frederick R. Evans of the First Christian church of Medford will officiate. Private interment will follow in Siskiyou Memorial park.

Mr. Myers was born in Grand Mount, Iowa, Nov. 6, 1893. On Oct. 8, 1919, in Rock Island, Ill., he was married to Thelma M. Hall, who survives. He had been an employee of the Associated Gear and Machine company in Los Angeles, Calif., for nine years. Mr. and Mrs. Myers had resided in Los Angeles for 40 years, prior to his retirement 2 1/2 years ago when they moved to Medford.

Surviving, besides his wife, is one sister, Mrs. Jesse Barber, DeWitt, Iowa. Siskiyou Funeral Service, directors of Chapel in the Trees, is in charge of arrangements.
