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Holy Week in Spain Filled With Centuries Old Pageantry

Madrid—(UPI)—Spain's Holy Week beginning today is filled with centuries old pageantry combining the singing of Flamenco and the "payment" of sins by carrying crosses, walking on knees and walking with chains.

It is a serious week in Spain, a deeply religious Catholic country. But it is a week that is unique. In almost every city throughout the country there is a parade, some more colorful than others and with local twists but all based on the same theme—the atonement of sins. Men and women march in the parades with long, flow-

ing robes and tall, pointed hats that cover their faces. Some are dressed in purple, others in black or white. Some walk with long, heavy chains tied to their ankles. Others carry huge crosses on their backs and some even make the march on their knees. Many are barefoot and by the end of the march particularly if they are walking with chains, their footsteps on the cobbled streets leave blood.

Won't Be Recognized

The hat-mask covering the face is worn so the sinner will not be recognized and his "atonement" will be known only by God and himself.

The long parade is made at a slow walk, with drums and sometimes trumpets playing a death march. On the shoulders of a number of men the local replica of the Virgin, Jesus or some other saint, is carried. This usually includes an altar, plus the statue, and it takes as many as 20 men to carry it.

Probably the most famous of the statues is the "Black Christ" of the gypsies of Seville. This life-like figure, made from black wood, is carried through the streets of Triana, the gypsy section of Seville.

Sings Devotion

When these statues are carried through the streets, a spectator occasionally will detach himself from the crowd and sing his devotion to the Virgin, or Jesus, in "cante jondo" (deep singing) Flamenco. The thousands that line the streets, the marchers and the drums or trumpets, all remain silent as he sings. When he finishes, he is applauded, the drums resume and the march continues.
