People of Iraq Favor Meat-Vegetable Rolls

Dolmas is the name given the most popular of all main dishes enjoyed by the people of Iraq which is the Arab name for Mesopotamia, the area between the Euphrates and Tigris Rivers. Its capital is Baghdad, its population about 6 1/2 million. Rice and lamb are menu mainstays. This recipe makes six to eight servings.

1 1/2 cups rice
1 1/2 pounds minced (ground) lamb
1/2 cup butter or margarine
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup water
1 large head cabbage
2 green peppers
1 large Spanish onion
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup tomato juice
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 teaspoon sugar

Mix uncooked rice with meat and butter. Add salt, pepper and one-half cup water. Mix well. Remove cabbage leaves carefully. Wilt leaves in boiling water for five minutes. Remove center stem of each leaf and cut leaf in two. Place one tablespoon of meat mixture on each half leaf and roll into shape of cigar.

Cut off tops of peppers, remove seeds. Fill peppers three-fourths full of meat and rice. Cut off top of onion and slit one side. Wilt onion in boiling water sufficiently to remove each layer without breaking. Roll one teaspoon meat and rice mixture in each large onion leaf.

Place rolled cabbage and onion leaves in alternate layers in deep skillet with green peppers in center. Add salt, tomato juice and water to cover. Press a plate on the "dolmas" to keep them from bursting while boiling. Cover with skillet lid. Boil 15 minutes. Remove plate and sprinkle with lemon juice and sugar. Replace lid and simmer 45 minutes.

Strawberry Cheese Cake High Fashion on Menus

Fresh strawberries have put in a new-season appearance, but we use the fresh-frozen already sliced strawberries for this quick and festive, unbaked, Spring-time specialty. Recipe makes eight inch cake for eight portions of rich rarity.

1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1/2 cup sugar
3 eggs, separated
1/2 cup water
2 cups sieved cottage cheese
1 10-ounce package frozen sliced, California strawberries, thawed
2 teaspoons grated lemon rind
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 cup heavy cream, whipped
2 cups lemon wafer crumbs
1/2 cup melted butter or margarine

Combine gelatin and sugar; blend. Beat egg yolks; add water and gelatin mixture and cook over low heat, stirring constantly until thickened. Add cheese, undrained strawberries, lemon rind and lemon juice; mix well. Chill until slightly thickened. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold egg whites and cream into strawberry mixture. Meanwhile, combine lemon wafer crumbs and butter or margarine;

blend. Pass over bottom and sides of eight-inch spring form pan. Turn strawberry mixture into lemon crust; chill until firm.

What To Do With Those Hard-Cooked Easter Eggs

If your family has children, there is likely to be an appalling number of hard-cooked, fancily decorated eggs staring at you by mid-day. What to do with them? Refrigerate them as quickly as possible, use them up as soon as possible.

Use them in salad dressings, in salads; make sandwich fillings. Make deviled eggs by combining yolks with zesty seasonings and stuffing whites. Center one or more whole hard-cooked eggs in a meat loaf. Put halved, quartered, sliced or diced hard-cooked eggs in a well-seasoned cream sauce for casseroles or toast-pointing.

Sing Praises With Ham, Rejoice with Turkey

Whether you choose ham or lamb for Easter dinner, you'll be selecting a meat course traditional for the feast. If, however, you choose turkey, you'll be joining the ranks of many west coasters who enjoy turkey at Easter-time.

Ham has been a favorite Easter food since the Pagan Period. It was in this era that enterprising feasters, realizing that supplies of fresh meat were at low ebb in Spring, buried fresh pork legs in the sand by the sea after butchering in the fall and winter. By Spring the hams, cured by the action of salt water, were dug up and smoked. This is done quite differently nowadays. All ham wrappers tell how to bake it.

Lamb, too, was used to celebrate the Paschal or Easter feast in the Old World, particularly in Italy. Spring lamb has long been a favorite food here and is especially popular with westerners because we grow 50 per cent of the country's lamb, eat 21 per cent of it. Lamb roasting cuts are many. Consider a frenched or American leg of lamb, boneless sirloin, loin roast, boneless loin, rib, crown rib, square cut shoulder, cushion shoulder, rolled shoulder. Season in any favored way, roast on rack, fat side up, in shallow roasting pan; no water and no cover. A 325 degree oven, allowing 30 minutes per pound for medium done, 35 minutes per pound for well done.

Turkey, popular here the year around, is now a big bargain in good eating; is ideal where large families get together. Everybody knows how to roast turkey. Stuff in
