An added attraction will be background music with local musicians performing.

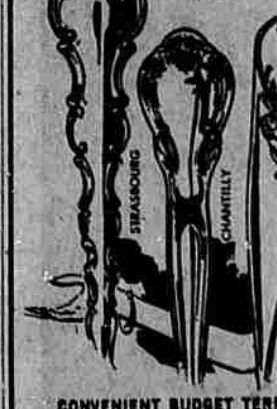
