On the evening's committee are Mrs. George Culy, Mrs. Faye Hall, Mrs. Keith Pace and Miss Edonna Pace.

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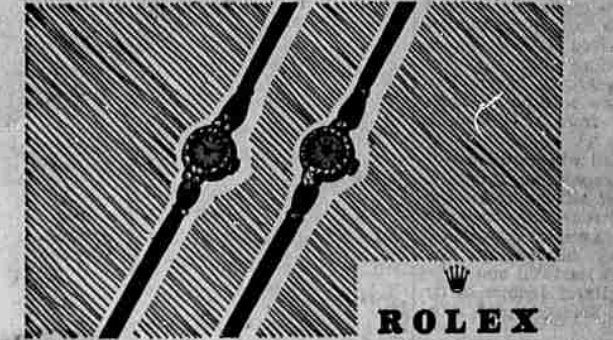
