Body of Iowa Boy Found Near Home

Winthrop, Iowa - (UP) - The body of a 4-year-old boy who disappeared just prior to a raging, early-March blizzard was found Saturday in a small gully only 385 yards from his home. Searchers came upon the body of Jimmy Franck only about an hour after 500 volunteers began a massive search over soggy Iowa farmlands. Authorities said the boy's body had been buried in shoulder-high snowdrifts. Medical Examiner Dr. John F. Loeck ruled the boy had frozen to death, "apparently after struggling for survival."
