University Program Leads To Doctorate

Eugene — A new program leading to the degree of doctor of philosophy in philosophy will be offered by the University of Oregon beginning in the fall of 1961.

The increasing demand for instructors in philosophy, and the fact that a doctoral program in philosophy is offered by only one other institution in the Northwest, were important factors in the decision to establish the new program, according to Dr. Albury Castell, head of the department of philosophy.

Centralized Power By Administration Discussed by Durno

If the people of this country follow President Kennedy and his apostles, they are going to be living in a planned economy and a regimented democracy, Oregon Congressman Edwin R. Durno declared yesterday in a talk to Medford Kiwanis club.

"If you do not believe in it, get out and get busy. You believe in it, work for it," the representative from Oregon's fourth congressional district advised.

The problem, according to the Medford physician and surgeon, is "do you want the federal government to do it for you" or can state and local governments serve best on local matters.

The present administration wants centralized power, Durno stated. He reported that Congress is supporting Kennedy 100 per cent in international affairs. Noting the necessity for rapid decisions, it has extended to the executive branch wide and discretionary powers.

Sees Same Urgency

The administration, Durno said, sees the same urgency and the same necessity for a high degree of central control in domestic affairs as it sees in the field of foreign affairs.

He spoke of a "demand for power."

Telling of the paradox in this country of having more people employed but more unemployment than ever before, Durno pointed to "cheap two-bit and four-bit labor overseas" as a cause of a serious problem to this country's economy. "We have won the war and lost the peace," the congressman asserted.

He mentioned the funds poured abroad for reconstruction of the economies of war-torn countries, and the sending of gold abroad now to establish foreign subsidiaries with which businesses in this country cannot compete.

As Much Attention

"This is indeed a serious problem," Durno said. He expressed the feeling that reciprocal trade matters, scheduled for review next year in Washington, D.C., will get as much attention as other important issues.

Addressing Kiwanians at their noon luncheon at Rogue Valley Country club, Durno assured them that "there is no gap so far as the destructive capacity of our military forces." He stated, also, that "Cold War" is just as much a war today as the "Hot War" was.

The congressman stated, "I think my version of the Dunes is the correct one." He spoke of the national shorelands bill he plans to introduce for the Oregon Dunes as an alternate to the bill, he opposes, submitted by Oregon Senator Maurine Neuberger for a national seashore park.

Provide Cooperation

The shoreland would be within national forest land, and would be administered by

the U.S. forest service. There would be no condemnation of property. Durno's bill would provide cooperation between state parks and the present private landowners in developing a recreation area.

Durno maintained that the shorelands possess scenic and wonderful recreational value. Concerning reports that the congressman had downgraded the scenic and recreational qualities of the land, Durno denied that he had done so and said that he had been quoted out of context.

He reported that he had stated that the Dunes did not match the scenic grandeur of Crater Lake and other national parks.

Discussing his vote in opposition to President Kennedy's minimum wage bill, which was defeated by one vote, Durno pointed out that the 186 to 185 vote was far short of the 437 total membership of the House of Representatives. He reported 45 Democrats stayed in the ante room because they did not wish to vote against the administration.
