

**San Francisco Pushing Rapid Transit System**

San Francisco - CBS - The San Francisco Bay area is striving for a \$1.1 billion rapid transit system which residents claim will be unique. The system would include 110 miles of line, counting 27 miles of tunnels and 8.8 miles of underwater tubes. It would serve 22 stations and five counties scattered on both sides of San Francisco Bay. By 1980 the system is expected to handle 150 million passenger trips yearly. This grandiose scheme is an answer to residents' head aches. The city of San Francisco, business center of the area, sits on the tip of a peninsula on the Golden Gate. It is only connected with the north by the Golden Gate bridge. And its only connection to Oakland in the east is over the double-decked San Francisco-Oakland Bay bridge. Because of mountains, most automobile traffic is jammed onto a few super-highways.

**Space Shortage**

As a result, there just is not enough road space for all the cars. Traffic is clogged to a standstill several times a day, and the problem is becoming worse as more people move into the area and more families acquire cars. Experts say the only answer to the problem is to persuade commuters to leaving their cars at home - and to travel, instead, on ultramodern, rapid transit vehicles hitting speeds up to 80 miles an hour.

They say the present public transportation system is not fast or economical enough. With rapid transit, the commuter would drive to a local parking station - and there would be space for a total of 45,000 cars - and board a relatively noiseless, comfortable, air-conditioned train.

To gain admission, he would insert a metal credit card into the turnstile, making it possible for him to be billed automatically by electronic computers at the end of his trip.

The cars, too, would be run by electronic means, which would allow them to start and stop on a second's notice.

The type of vehicles to be used has not been decided. They may be overland monorails or they may be on conventional tracks.

**Underwater Tubes**

The east-west traffic will require a 9.8 miles, \$117 million underwater tube. A bridge high enough to permit passage for ships would be too expensive.
