Members of the Seventh-day Adventist church of the Rogue valley will contribute Saturday to support an expansion program scheduled for the denomination's medical school on the West coast.

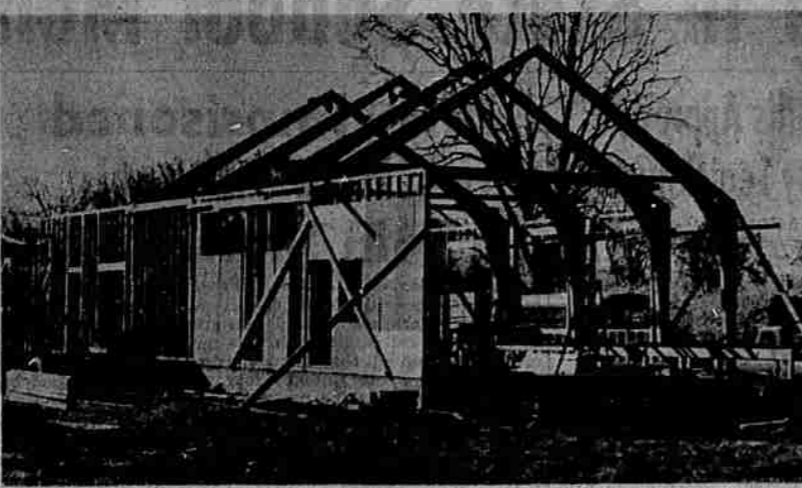
The College of Medical Evangelists at Loma Linda, Calif., graduates about 75 physicians annually.

### Congress Is Example of Religion Diversity

Washington (UPI)—America's religious diversity is illustrated by the church affiliations of the nation's Congressmen, cabinet officers and Supreme Court justices.

No less than 24 different denominations are represented among the 534 members of Congress.

The most numerous are Roman Catholics. There are 98. The Catholic Church is the nation's largest religious body, with some 40 million members.

Methodists are a close second with 94 members in the House and Senate. The Methodist Church is the largest U.S. Protestant body, with about 10 million members.

The 4 million Presbyterians can claim 72 members of their church in Congress, while the 3 million Episcopalians can count 67 of their members in the legislative branch.

The various Baptist denominations, with an aggregate membership of 14 million, have 66 members in Congress.

Other religious bodies with more than 10 members in Congress are the Congregationalists (28), Lutherans (22), Disciples of Christ (18), and Jews (12).

Other faiths which have one or more members in Congress include: Mormons, Christian Scientists, Churches of Christ, Unitarians, Universalists, Evangelical and Reformed, Evangelical Free Church, Apostolic Christian, Brethren in Christ, Cumberland Presbyterian, Evangelical United Brethren, Quakers, Schwenkfelders and Sikhs.

The Sikh faith of India, in case you are wondering, is represented by Rep. D. S. Saund (D-Calif.).

The actual diversity may be even wider than the above list indicates. Twenty members of Congress list their affiliation only as "Protestant," while three do not list any religious preference.

President Kennedy is a Catholic. Among the 10 members of his cabinet, there are two Jews, two Methodists, two Presbyterians, one Episcopalian, one Mormon, one Catholic and one Lutheran.

Among the nine justices of the Supreme Court are three Presbyterians, one Methodist, one Episcopalian, one Catholic, one Jew, and two "Protestants" who do not specify their church affiliation (Chief Justice Earl Warren and Justice Hugo L. Black).

### The CHRISTIAN SABBATH

Sabbath is from a Hebrew word meaning rest. God finished His work of creation in 6 days and rested the 7th (Genesis 2:2). God commanded Israel, "Remember the sabbath day to keep it holy." Neither Israel, their servants, their cattle, nor strangers within their gates were allowed to work on the 7th day (Exodus 20:8-10).

This law was given Israel at Mt. Sinai because God delivered THEM from Egypt (Deuteronomy 5:8-15), and was unknown to them before (Nehemiah 9:12-14). The sabbath law was a sign between God and Israel and was to last throughout their generation, the Jewish age (Exodus 31:12-17).

Israel had other sabbaths besides the 7th day. The 1st, 10th and 15th of the 7th month (Leviticus 16:29, 23:24 & 39) and the 7th year (Leviticus 25:4) were among these. God promised an end to the sabbath law when "I will cause the sun to go down at noon, and I will darken the earth in the clear day" (Amos 8:4-9). This prophecy was fulfilled with Christ on the cross (Luke 23:44-45).

Christ kept the sabbath because he was a Jew and lived under the law. The apostles went into the synagogues on the sabbath, after the cross, to preach Christ, and not to keep the sabbath (Acts 9:20, 13:14-37, 14:1-7, 17:1-4, 18:1-6, etc.). Paul met with Christians "upon the first day of the week" to remember Christ's death. (Acts 20:7, 1 Corinthians 11:23-26).

Christ fulfilled the 10 commandment law, given at Mt. Sinai, "and nailed it to His cross" (Colossians 2:12-17, Galatians 3). We are as free from that law (including the sabbath) as a woman is from her dead husband (Romans 7:1-7).

God entered into His rest when His works were FINISHED. We (Christians) shall enter into God's rest when we have finished our God given works. "There REMAINETH therefore a rest to the people of God. For he that is entered into his rest, he ALSO HATH CEASED from his own works, as GOD did from His. Let us LABOR therefore to enter into that rest. (Hebrews 4:11). The Christian sabbath (rest) is eternal life, of which the sabbath of Israel was only a type.
