Sweetland Plans To Quilt Legislature

Salem - (UPI) - Sen. Monroe Sweetland (D-Milwaukee) said today he plans to leave the legislature when his term expires next year. That would make 10 years in the state legislature, and Sweetland said he considered it enough for the time being. Sweetland, publisher of the Milwaukee Review, said he felt it was time to "move along to other fields of interest." He declined to elaborate. Sweetland was twice defeated in races for secretary of state, in 1956 and 1960.
