

# Eichmann Affair Said To Be Serving Communist Propaganda Purposes

New York—AP—The Adolph Eichmann affair has served as a pretext for a Communist bloc propaganda campaign against the West German government and former Nazi officials.

The central theme of the campaign is that "revanchist" West Germany is full of unregenerate Nazis in high positions bent on war, and that the United States and its allies share responsibility for condition.

The Communist line pictures the Soviet bloc regimes as friends of the Jews and reminds the world that thousands of citizens of bloc countries fell before Nazi guns in World War II.

An underlying factor in the campaign is Russia's historical fear of Germany as a European power and the concern over West Germany's rearming as a member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

Israel's announcement last May 23 of the capture of Eichmann, the accused mass murderer of Jews under Hitler, was the signal for a series of charges in the Polish press against the Bonn government of Chancellor Konrad Adenauer.

The articles claimed that Adenauer's government had no interest in ridding itself of remaining former high-ranking Nazis. The Poles claimed

that West German had rejected documentary evidence against ex-Nazi Gen. Hermann Krüme, butcher of Lidice, who had been living in Korbach since the end of the war.

On June 3, Bonn rejected the charge, saying that the evidence had been offered not by the Polish government, but by Communist East German representatives.

On June 12, "Neues Deutschland," official organ of the Communist East German regime, alleged that West German diplomats induced Argentina to demand Eichmann's return because Bonn feared his trial in Israel would reveal that many West German government officials "helped him in his crimes." Eichmann was captured in Argentina by Israeli agents and taken secretly to Israel.

Said "Co-Perpetrators" On Nov. 3 in Prague, Prof. Rudolf Bystricky of the Czech Union of antifascist fighters lashed out against alleged high-ranking Bonn officials as "co-perpetrators in Eichmann's crimes."

Last month, the Hungarian Federation of victims of Fascism charged that Wilhelm Haack, "one of the most active perpetrators of the extermination of Hungarian Jewish intellectuals," was living unmolested in Austria.

The Communists instituted new trials against ex-Nazis, using them as much as possible for anti-Western propaganda.

In late August, Moscow radio charged that Alex Laak, former concentration camp commandant wanted for trial in Tallin, Estonia, was living in Winnipeg, Ont. On Sept. 7 Laak committed suicide.

Canadian Baltic exile groups claimed that Soviet Union had been ranking under their "captive-nations" propaganda at the United Nations.

On Feb. 24, Moscow radio announced that Ralf Gerrets, former vice commandant of the Jagala, Estonia, concentration camp, would go on trial July 3 for the murder of 6,000 inmates in the 1940s.

**Sentenced to Death** At the same time Moscow demanded that Australia turn over "war criminal Erwin Richard Adolf Petrovich Viks" of Sydney for the same purpose.

Three days later, three former Lithuanian policemen were sentenced to death for

war crimes by the Soviet union. And a week later — not July 3 as first announced — Gerrets and Jan Vlik, an alleged accomplice, went on trial. They were executed later.

The day Gerrets and Vlik went on trial Moscow radio pointed out to its listeners that it was seeking the extradition from England of Aine Erwin Mere, whom it described as a "number one butcher" in wartime Estonia and fugitive from U. S. occupation forces in Germany in 1945.

Mere replied that his conscience is clear. Britain refused his extradition, as did Australia the extradition of Vlik on March 18.

In Riga, Latvia, four former German officers and five ex-soldiers were tried on charges of murdering 3,000 Jews in a small town during the Nazi occupation, and other acts.

The same day, the Soviet Ne ws Agency Tass published an open letter from the "cit-

zens of Ukmerge, Lithuania" to the people of Chicago, exhorting them to aid in the extradition of alleged mass executioner Meis Pashkevich, alias Mikas Povilonis, of 3344 Irving Park rd., Chicago, 18.

(No one by that name could be found at the address.)

**Damaging Testimony Feared** Some Western and neutral diplomatic quarters believe the Communist bloc is not only anxious to press its anti-Western line, but fearful that testimony at the Eichmann trial might bring out evidence damaging to Communists, too.

The liberal Stockholm newspaper "Dagens Nyheter" spoke to this point on March 11 in an editorial on the Tallin trial.

"The one and only aim of a trial should be to punish those guilty and to administer justice. If other aims become obvious as in this case, the confidence of the process is undermined."

It then besought the Communist press to reveal "the innumerable acts of violence which Soviet authorities have committed in the Baltic countries," and concluded: "before this is done, one cannot speak of justice."

**Sons' Contract Overrides Father's Will**

Hiram died leaving three sons, Adam, Bob and Cain. Hiram had executed a will shortly before his death giving most of his property to Adam, Bob and Cain each received about one-fifth of Hiram's assets. Shortly after Hiram's death, his three children entered into a contract whereby they agreed to withhold Hiram's will from probate and to divide his property equally. Later Adam's wife, Jill, insisted that Adam attempt to obtain the lion's share of the property in accordance with the will. Will Adam succeed if he succumbs to his wife's commands?

**THE COURT HELD:** The three sons will divide the property equally and Adam and Jill will have to be content with one-third of Hiram's assets. This answer is based on the assumption that there was no fraud or misdealing involved in relation to the contract. If all of the interested parties agree to divide a decedent's property in a manner other than that provided for in his will most courts will enforce the agreement. Although the decedent's desires are not carried out, it is recognized by the courts that the parties can divide the property any way that they might desire after it is distributed to them and an enforceable contract relating to distribution makes probate unnecessary. (60 S. W. 2d 378, Ky.)

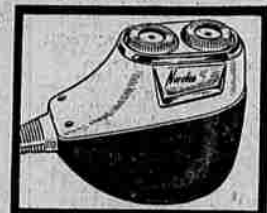
