POUND OF COFFEE STRETCHED

Americans' Coffee Drinking Habits Can Have International Repercussion

Washington — (UPI) — The United States has become so involved in world affairs that even our coffee drinking habits can have international repercussions.



At the moment, for instance, there is grave concern in the Pan American Coffee Bureau over the coffee brewing trends in this country.
The bureau, which keeps its ear to the ground, if not in the grounds, on all matters concerning coffee, has discovered that we are tending to make the stuff weaker than we once did.
Ten years ago, it reports, the average U.S. housewife made 46 cups from one pound of coffee. But nowadays she stretches a pound into 83 cups.
When you consider that we drink more coffee than the rest of the world combined, you can see why the bureau is concerned over the stretch-out.

I picked up this information, along with a free cup of strong brew, at a "coffee hour" which the bureau sponsored Tuesday in the old Supreme Court chamber in the capitol.
Among those partaking of its hospitality was Mrs. Lady Bird Johnson, wife of the vice president, who was presented with a silver ladle for use in measuring coffee.
"We're sorry it's not Texas size," said the bureau official who made the presentation.

A friendly press agent who happened to be standing nearby told me that the ladle, which holds two tablespoons of coffee, had been adopted by the bureau as the "standard" measure for a cup of coffee.
"We're trying to give one to Jackie," he confided.
I also learned, between sips, that Latin American countries whose economies are largely dependent on coffee exports are trying to find new ways to use surplus products.
Among other things, they are turning coffee beans into fertilizer and making them into a paste fodder for cattle.
