New York —(UPI)— The new Minnesota Vikings will start play in the National Football league as a member of the Western conference and the Dallas Cowboys will shift to the Eastern division, Commissioner Pete Rozelle has announced today.

In releasing the expanded schedule for 1961, Rozelle announced that each club in the league will play a home-and-home series with each of the six other teams in its division, plus two games against teams from the opposite division.

14-Game Slat

Each team will play a 14-game schedule starting Sept. 17, making a total of 98 games. This will mean one additional home game and another on the road for each club.

With the addition of the Vikings as the 14th club in the NFL, it was feared at last December's league meeting that both Minnesota and Dallas would have to compete as "swing" teams in 1961, that is, they would have to play every other club in the league once.

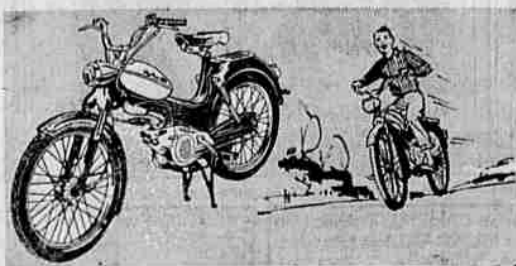

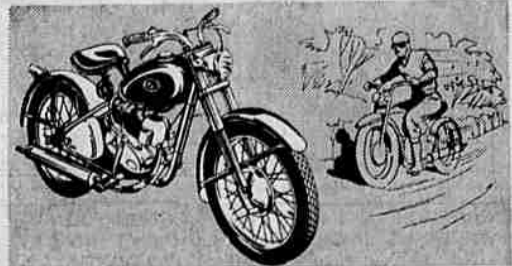

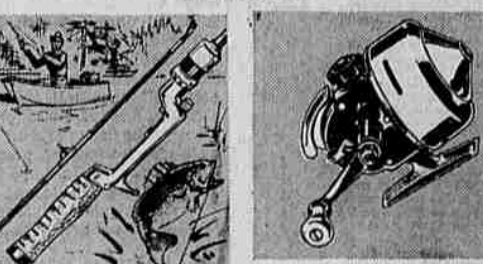
