Throbbing in the Body After a Meal

A number of people ask me why they feel a throbbing in the chest or perhaps all over the body after they eat a meal, or drink some hot coffee or take some soup, or take a couple of drinks which contain alcohol. My answer would be that this isn't necessarily a sign of disease, but only a sign of over-sensitiveness.

Many persons feel hot and perspiring after a meal, and some feel the throbbing. I sometimes have these sensations. As I remember, they come when I have a cold. The cold probably has made my reflexes more sensitive.

In rare cases, a highly nervous and jittery person, on starting to eat, will go into an awful "tizzy" in which he or she shakes all over, perhaps perspires profusely, or has a rapid pulse with palpitation. The bowels may feel as if they are going to move, the person may get goose-flesh here and there, and he may feel as if he were about to die. Almost always, when I find a person as sensitive as that, I discover that he has had some relatives who were nervous even worse than his.

Some persons have trouble drinking a couple of glasses of wine or a couple of highballs because later their whole body will throb. The probable reason for this is that alcohol lowers the blood pressure and this causes the waves in the arteries to be bigger than usual. What I do not understand is that if I drink some wine at dinner, my throbbing may wake me about 2 o'clock in the morning. This is late for an effect of alcohol.
