

MULTI-BARK

Spring is the time for planting and soil conditioning. For your landscaping needs MULTI-BARK will act as both an organic soil conditioner and mulch. And . . . remember . . . at KOGAP you have a choice of fine, medium and coarse grind as well as a choice of bark type: Douglas fir or white fir.

The fine is recommended only for light mulching on newly seeded lawns or to conserve moisture in established lawns, and should not be applied over 1/4" deep. To insure uniform application we have Multi-Bark spreaders that we will loan out on purchases of the fine Multi-Bark for lawns.

The medium grade is the best all-around grade. When used as a mulch to control weeds and conserve moisture it should be applied about 3" deep. It will not pack or blow around like the fine grade. And, due to the coarseness of the material water will enter much more rapidly. The medium grade Multi-Bark is also the best for conditioning the soil. When mixed into heavy clay soil it will give a desirable crumbly structure making it more favorable for seed germination and plant growth. It is also beneficial for light sandy soil by improving its ability to hold moisture.

Because of Multi-Bark's slow decomposition rate it will last for a long time and make your gardening and landscaping a pleasure instead of a chore. Multi-Bark is recommended by nursery men and landscape architects to improve your soil and beautify your landscape.

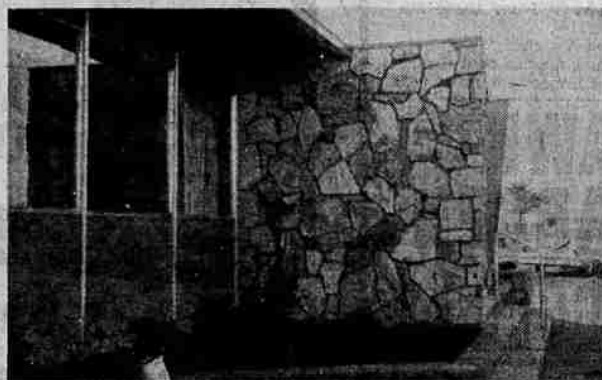
