**Bold, Dynamic Program Seen To Fight Communism Spread**

The United States must have a bold and dynamic program to promote a free people and free nations for this hemisphere and to prevent the further spread of Communism, Mrs. Helen Cudworth told an audience at a meeting of Rogue River Valley Knife and Fork club last night at Rogue Valley Country club.  
"We of this time can be just as creative as our founding fathers," she said. "Freedom is just as surely at stake now as it was in the early days. We must match the design and purpose of this program to the size of the challenge."  
Mrs. Cudworth, whose topic concerned the Latin American countries and the relationship of these nations with the United States, warned that Communism has gained a considerable foothold in many of these nations largely through the lack of foresight of U.S. officials and leaders and "our many blunders."  
"We have failed to realize the depth and scope of the social and economic revolutions which are going on in the Latin American countries," Mrs. Cudworth said. She pointed out that although this nation boasts of its democracy, that we had failed to support the efforts of Central and South Americans to set up democratic governments and to improve their conditions.  
"In many instances our official policy has been to remain friendly with dictators - openly and excessively friendly," she declared. "Instead of promoting democracy. How can we fail to realize that our best weapon against Communism is to promote democracy?"  
Mrs. Cudworth declared that in the past official representatives of the United States to Latin American countries almost always confined their contacts and friendships to the heads of established governments "and spoke only to government and its leaders, not to the people. The Communists, on the other hand, always speak to the masses. We have seemed against agrarian reform, social evolution and educational reform in Latin America," she declared.  
It is imperative that these policies and practices be reversed, Mrs. Cudworth said, and that the people of the Latin American nations be made to realize that the United States is anxious to promote their welfare.  
She pointed out that in the past, economic aid to these nations had almost always been of a negative character, made only where necessary to offset some move of the Soviets, and not because it was a sound move.  
The economic and social stability of the North American countries is irrevocably tied up with that of the Latin American nations, she stressed, and said "we cannot afford to have hostile powers to the south." She pointed out that this country's goals and aims, "liberty, freedom and the importance of the individual" are the same as the people of the nations to the south, and that "we could lose the cold war unless our ties with them are strengthened."  
Mrs. Cudworth spoke briefly about the history of the Latin Americas, stressed the difference in the education, culture and standard of living as compared to North Americans, and added "the importance of our relationships is equalled only by our ignorance about Latin America." She said this nation had made little effort, on any level, to understand the people to the south, and failed to take the advice of their leaders and experts in dealing with them and when offering them help.  
**Not Only Problem**  
Saying that Communism is not the only pressing problem of Latin America, Mrs. Cudworth spoke of the extreme poverty and illiteracy of the Indians, saying that in some sections they are little better than serfs; of the fact that a few wealthy families have literally controlled entire countries, and the exploding population, adding that the birth rate is the highest in the world.  
She added that it is now understood that education of the masses is imperative, and that some countries have made considerable progress against illiteracy.  
Mrs. Cudworth said that the major set-back to the sta-

ministration can stop Communism, improve their economic position and education and help eradicate disease. It is frightening how much they expect of us, and what will happen if their aspirations are not fulfilled."  
The speaker was introduced by John Pletsch. She is a guest in Medford of Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Tobin, long-time friends, and tonight speaks for the Siskiyou Knife and Fork club, Ashland.
