

# Grant and Cottage Grove Capture Hayward Relays Championships

## Medford Finishes Fourth

### Crater Third in Class A Division

Eugene — Favorites came through in the Metropolitan and Class A conflicts of the Hayward relay track and field meet here yesterday afternoon as Grant of Portland and Cottage Grove were triumphant by wide margins in this prep thirled carnival.

Grant, with firsts in the 440-yard, 880-yard and shuttle hurdle relays and a tie for first in the high jump, rolled up 60 1/5 points in the Metro class. Hudson's Bay of Vancouver, Wash., was second with 36 1/2. Cottage Grove's Lyons, with victories in the discus, shot put, 880 and mile relays, outdistanced its Class A foes with 81 3/4. Bend was next with 41 3/4.

**Tornado Takes Mile**

Medford, one-time perennial champ in the biggest school division, made its best finish since last winning the Metro four years ago. The Black Tornado was fourth with 30 1/2, back of Marshfield's 36 1/5. Medford had one first as its gang of Jack Lowery, Bob Rix, Kent Blew and Bob McIntyre took the mile event in 3:29.5.

Crater, always a contender in Class A, was third this year with 37 1/2. Ashland with 24 3/4 was fifth behind North Bend's 29 1/2. The Comets of Crater tied with West Linn and Bend at 16 feet 6 inches for first place in the high jump. Bob Voris took the high hurdles at 15.2 for Ashland, beating the Metro winning time.

Grants Pass, which last week won the Rogue relays at Medford, was 14th in the Metro division with 8 7/10. Klamath Falls had two points.

**Davies Sets Mark**

In Metro yesterday the discus record fell to Dave Davies of Hudson's Bay with 164-1. Jefferson's Larry Grant, Dick Daniel and Roy Taylor combined in the broad jump for a new mark of 65-2 3/4. Bryan Klotz, David Douglas, became new record holder in the pole vault with 13-3.

In Class A Cottage Grove set marks of 149-3 in the shot put and 3:33.9 in the mile. Jesuit set a new standard of 8:19.6 in the two-mile.

Medford took third in the shot put with 140-11, third in the 880 with 1:32.5, tied for third in the shuttle hurdles with 34.7, and tied for fifth in the 440 with 44.9. Mike Hood was fifth in the high hurdles. Grants Pass took third in the mile and tied with Medford for fifth in the 440. Vic Van Koten of the Cavemen tied for third at 11-6 in the pole vault. Allen Phillips, Klamath Falls, was fifth in the javelin with 179-2 1/2.

**Comets Place**

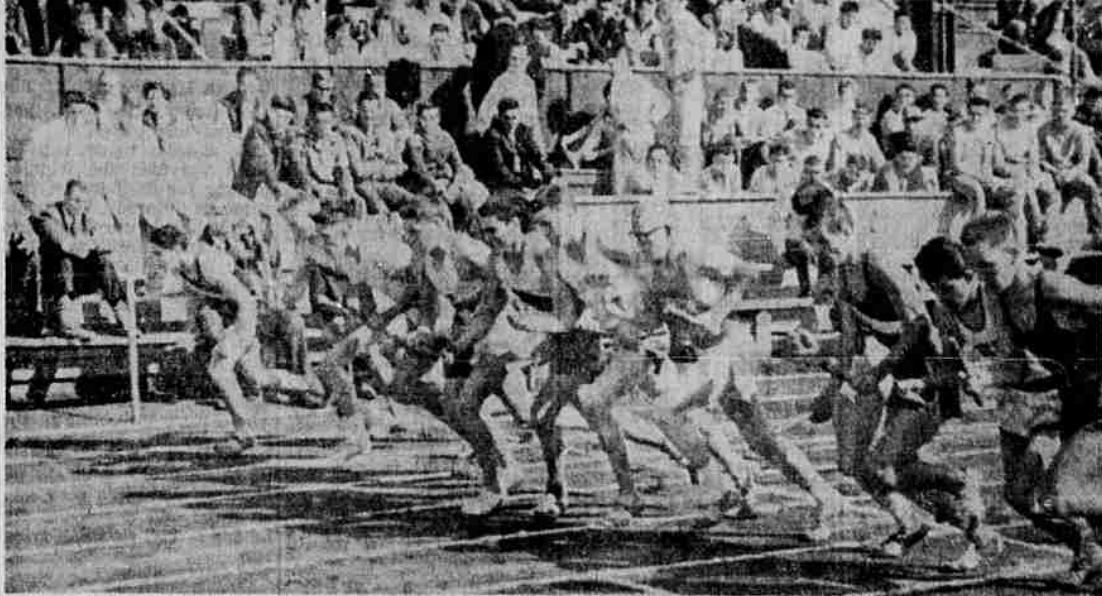
Dwight James, Ron Beman and Bryson LCase combined in the high jump for Crater. The Comets were third in the 880 with a 1:34.1, second in the 440 in 46.1, fourth in the shot put with 128-3 and sixth in the distance medley with 11:47.3. In the javelin Wayne Martin and Gil Harrison of Crater took third and fifth. Martin threw 168-7. John Champ tied for fifth in the high hurdles.

Ashland was third in the distance medley in 11:36.5 and Dave Colwell of the Grizzlies knotted for fifth in the pole vault at 11-4.

# St. Mary's First, Rogue River Second in C Division Haywards

Eugene—St. Mary's of Medford continued its reign as the dominant small high school in Oregon track and field here Friday by capturing the Class C championship in the annual Hayward relays.

Scappoose won the Class B crown for the second year.

The Class C action for the second year in a row saw a southern Oregon sweep. St. Mary's triumphed by a crushing decisive margin of 34 points. The Crusaders piled up 80 3/4. Rogue River came next with 26 3/4. Canyonville Bible took third with 25 3/4.

Three first places went to St. Mary's which placed in nine of the 11 events.

Scappoose led 5 with 52 3/4. Coquille was runnerup with 42 and Madas had 28 1/2.

(Southern Oregon Class B scores included Henley 5 1/2, Phoenix 5, Illinois Valley 1 and Eagle Point 7 1/2.)

For Rogue River the distance medley crew took second, the 440 gang fourth and the shuttle hurdles combination sixth. Olymplus tied for third in the high jump.

Other Richey was the only Rogue valley winner in Class B taking the javelin with 177-6. For Illinois Valley Dave Kennedy tied for fifth in the high hurdles and fourth in the pole vault. Eagle Point knotted for sixth in the shuttle hurdles and Lew Whipple of the Eagles tied for fourth in the high jump.

McGee, Darland, Mete and Pat Stinson teamed for St. Mary's in the spint medley and Pete Naumes, Evans and Elliott in the shuttles. John

Lucas, Austin, Stinson and Rouhier ran in the distance medley.

# SIX UNDER PAR Souchak Leads Greensboro

Greensboro, N.C.—Burly Mike Souchak, a former Duke university football player, sank birdie putts on the 15th and 18th holes Saturday to take a two-stroke lead in the \$22,500 Greater Greensboro Open Golf tournament.

Souchak fired a 69 for a 54-hole total of six-under-par 207. The Grossinger, N.Y., golfer and Billy Maxwell of Dallas, Tex., were tied going into Saturday's round. However, Maxwell fired a 71.

Three strokes off the pace at 210 was Charles Sifford, a Negro golf pro from Los Angeles who led the field of

115 pros and amateurs after the first round. The field in the 24th annual G.G.O., richest golfing event in the Carolinas, was cut to 60 low pros and ties plus 10 amateurs Friday.

Stan Leonard, the veteran Canadian from Vancouver, and Slammin' Sammy Snead, who is seeking his eighth crown here, were tied at one-under-par 212.

Leonard and Snead each fired 89 on the par 71 Seaside Country club course.

Only five players were under par after the third round of the tournament, which

winds up Sunday afternoon.

Maxwell, a chunky north Texas product, held a one stroke edge over Souchak after the first nine holes yesterday with a two-under-par 33. He shot birdies on the third and ninth holes while Souchak bogied the first and birdied the fourth.

Doug Sanders of Ojai, Calif., and Buddy Sullivan of Yuba City, Calif., were even par after 54 holes with 213's.

Sifford, who put on a startling putting exhibition the first day, had trouble on the greens Saturday. "I had a lot of chances," Sifford said, "but the putts just wouldn't drop."

He is the first Negro to play in the G.G.O. and the first of his race ever to compete in a PGA co-sponsored tournament in the south. He hit 16 greens, missing one and four.
