

Research Scientist Killed in Mishap

Stanford, Calif. - (UPI) - Dr. Phillips B. Gallagher, 33, a research scientist who helped make the first radar contact with the sun, was electrocuted Thursday in a laboratory accident.

Stanford university authorities said the scientist was holding a metal "probe" for an oscilloscope when it accidentally touched a cable carrying 5,000 volts.
