Rocking Chairs Making Comeback, Thanks To Use by President Kennedy

Washington—(UPI)—The rocking chair, most authorities agree, is one of the most versatile pieces of furniture ever invented. If you are spending an evening by the fire, and don't happen to have a hammer available, you can use it for cracking chestnuts.

As something to stumble over in a dark room, it has no equal. And, if bad comes to worse, you can even sit in it.

Despite those utilitarian virtues, the rocking chair, or "rocker" as it is commonly

called, was until a few years ago well along the road toward obsolescence. Its place in modern households was rapidly being usurped by the sling chair, which is the only practical method ever devised for bringing the discomforts of the hammock indoors.

Now, however, thanks to President Kennedy, rocking chairs are making a comeback. The recent disclosure that he occasionally takes his ease in a rocker has made them fashionable again.

Time for Research
Well, sure, never let it be said that a new sitting trend caught me resting my haunches on somebody's Chippendale. Let it be said that I was out collecting information on the subject.

Here, then, based on consultation with the Smithsonian Institution and the National Geographic Society, is my report on the origin and evolution of the rocking chair.

Available records indicate that rockers were first attached to chairs about 200 years ago. Some furniture historians believe the rocking chair was invented by Benjamin Franklin. Others think differently.

At any rate, it definitely was an American invention. Not even the Russians argue about that.

If Franklin didn't invent the rocking chair, he at least improved the basic design. He rigged one so that the rocking motion would cause a fan to wave, and thus keep flies away.

Invents Attachments
Later on, another inventor outdid Franklin. He hooked up a rocking chair so that it would "oscillate the cradle and vibrate at the same time the dasher of the churn."

His purpose in that was to "employ the hitherto wasted female power." I assume that he was not having spent a lot of time rocking when she should have been churning.

Aaron Burr is said to have courted an Indian princess in a two-seated rocking chair. I

don't know how that worked out.

A rocking chair also figured in an historic event of far greater significance. Abraham Lincoln was sitting in one at the time of his assassination.

Some doctors, including President Kennedy's, recommend rocking as a fine way to relax and still get a little exercise. Rocking, it would seem, is better for you than just sitting there. It might even help keep you from going off your rocker.
