Water Supply Report Presented

A report designed to help plan the city of Medford's future water supply system was in the hands of city officials today.

Called the "Feasibility of Water Supply for the Medford Fringe Area," the report was prepared by Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield Consulting Engineers for the Medford water commission.

The chief purpose of the report is to furnish information which will assist the commission in determining whether future water service will be contained within the area now supplied, expanded to serve the entire Bear Creek valley, or reduced to provide only for the future needs of the city within the present city limits.

With the information contained in the report the commission hopes to continue its plans for providing an expanded water supply system for the city of Medford and vicinity. It has been estimated that the city will be using the maximum water available from its Big Butte Springs water supply system by 1967.
