DAR May Vote To Strengthen Cuba Resolution

Washington - (UPI) - The Daughters of the American Revolution may toughen up a proposed resolution condemning Communist infiltration of Cuba. The DAR's 70th Continental Congress was slated to vote today on a resolution reaffirming the principle of the Monroe Doctrine and a series of other policy proposals. Delegates had had a day to study the Cuban resolution. It calls for work toward an early end to the Communist infiltration of Central and South America, especially in the Caribbean area. It obviously was drawn up before the latest development in Cuba. Peace Corps Target The 2,528 members attending the week-long meeting at Constitution Hall also were expected to approve a proposal attacking President Kennedy's Peace Corps. A proposed resolution said the nation would be sending inexperienced youths on a global mission against highly trained Communist technicians. Tuesday night, Dan Smoot, radio commentator and publisher of the Dan Smoot report pamphlets, told the convention that "the silence of conservatives is a deadly sin." Minimum Wage Due Senate Test

Washington - (UPI) - President Kennedy's \$1.25 an hour minimum wage bill, already over a big Senate hurdle, today faced the highest one yet. A vote was expected on an amendment by Sen. A. S. Mike Monroney (D-Okla.) to reduce coverage of the administration proposal. Administration forces refused to predict the outcome. The target of the amendment is a measure calling for extension of Wage-Hour Act coverage to 4.1 million new workers. Most of the new workers are in retail and service industries, and Monroney said the administration bill "shocked" his conscience because it would apply to businesses grossing more than \$1 million a year even if they operate within a single state. His amendment would trim about 1.6 million of the new workers off the Kennedy bill by stipulating a business must operate in more than one state to come under the law. The administration bill Tuesday got past a substitute plan offered by conservatives.

College Aid Bill Over Big Hurdle

Washington - (UPI) - President Kennedy's \$2.4 billion college aid bill was over its first big hurdle today. But his \$2.3 billion plan to help grade and high schools approached the same obstacle with far dimmer prospects of success. A House education subcommittee approved the college bill late Tuesday. It carried the basic proposals advanced by the President to build teaching facilities and help talented but needy college students pay for their education. Kennedy's aid plan for public elementary and secondary schools was taken up at closed-door session today by another subcommittee. Its supporters have conceded they might have to give ground to get a bill before the House.

Open House Planned At New Building of Domestic Laundry

The formal opening of the Domestic Laundry and Dry Cleaning plant, 30 North Riverside ave., Medford, which was completely rebuilt and expanded since the establishment was swept by fire last year, will be held Thursday, April 20, according to Owner-Manager Al Dumas. The public is invited to inspect the facilities that make it one of the most modern plants of its kind in the Pacific northwest, representing an investment of \$200,000, and more than doubling the output potential of the previous facilities, Dumas said. Open house will be held from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. Thursday. Features of the modernized plant include an automatic shirt finisher that eliminates much tedious hand work, a hydraulic moisture extractor, a giant ironer for flatwork and a completely automatic power plant and boiler system, in addition to the new dry cleaning machine. The new building was constructed back some distance from the street to allow room for a parking area. Early Establishment The Domestic Laundry was first established in 1909, and is one of Medford's early businesses, as well as being one of the oldest laundries in the

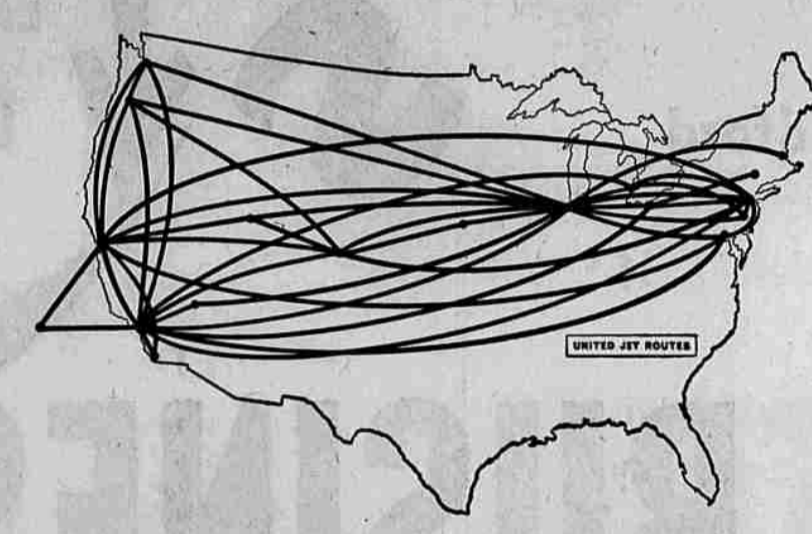
