Strike Halts Work At Missile Sites Denver — UP — An electrical workers strike tied up work today at 11 Titan and Atlas missile launch sites in Colorado while a federal mediator tried to resolve a union dispute with the Martin and Conva companies. The Northern Colorado Building and Construction Trades Council cancelled a no-strike agreement with the Martin Company last week. Walkouts at Titan launch sites around Denver began Tuesday. By Thursday, 700 electrical workers were on strike and a total of 4,000 construction workers were idle at six Martin Company Titan sites and five Conva Atlas sites in northern Colorado.
