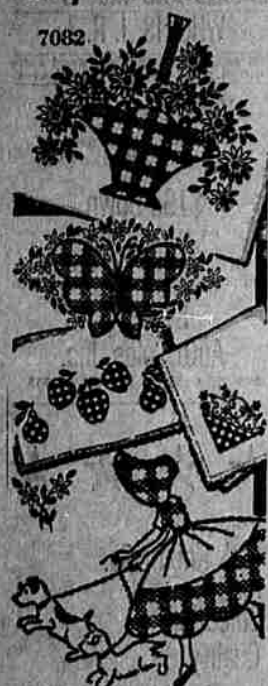

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Legal Opposition Position Noted By Peter Gunnar

Grants Pass—The Republican party at the federal level has the hard job of "being proper legal opposition" for the next four years, according to Peter Gunnar, Salem, chairman of the Western Republican State Chairman's association, who spoke in Grants Pass last night.

"This task is particularly difficult in foreign affairs," he remarked.

"We Republicans must constantly make it completely clear that in foreign affairs our president acts with the support of all Americans, regardless of party," Gunnar emphasized.

"On the other hand, we have a duty to the American people to discuss openly and frankly our foreign policy in the making," Gunnar said.

Republican Duty
"This is a Republican duty now because half of the people voted for the Republican conduct and concepts in foreign affairs," he said.

"Many Americans, and I am one of them, join Sen. Thruston B. Morton, Republican National Committee chairman, in a deep concern over the proposed coalition solution in Laos. History shows clearly that neutralist coalitions which include totalitarian agents, whether Communist or Fascist, quickly are overcome by those enemies of freedom. Every U.S. expert on the scene opposes this solution," Gunnar said.

Gunnar presented the Josephine county precinct workers with certificates of achievement in 1960 signed by former vice president Richard Nixon, National Chairman Morton, Gov. Mark Hatfield, Josephine County Chairman W. T. Plummer and Gunnar.

Linfield Receives Foundation Grants

McMinnville—Eight Linfield college science students will benefit from two grants recently made available to the college through the National Science Foundation.

One grant for \$1,220 comes under the Undergraduate Independent Study Program of NSF. Through this grant, five physics students will work on student research projects. Linfield is the only institution in the Pacific Northwest to receive such a grant.

The other grant was received by Linfield Research Institute as an NSF supplemental grant for summer work for two Linfield physics students and one Linfield biology student. The students may now earn \$150 during the academic year and \$800 during summers each year at LRI. Value of this NSF grant is \$4,130.

Twenty-five Greyhound Bus line agents and sales representatives recently attended an all-day "schooling" on the line's services and methods to convey information about them to the public. The school was held at the Medford hotel.

Representatives from southern Oregon and northern California attended the travel promotion session. Instructing was done by O. W. Gerfin, regional sales manager; G. R. Hammond, city sales manager; I. L. Carew and G. C. Teeling, district sales representatives.

Bus line officials predicted a "healthy increase" in escorted and individual vacation tours, both to and from northern and central California this year.

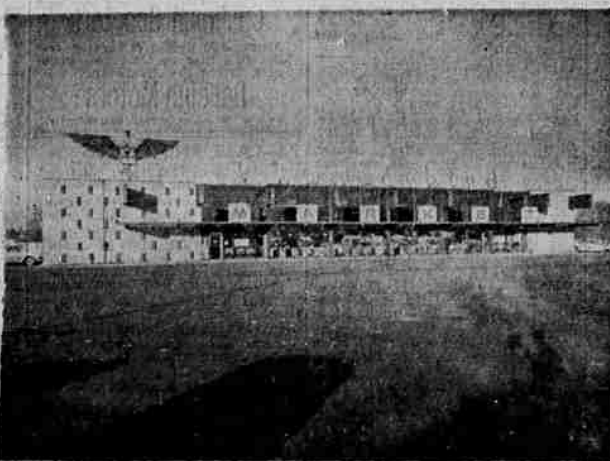
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THUNDERBIRD MARKET

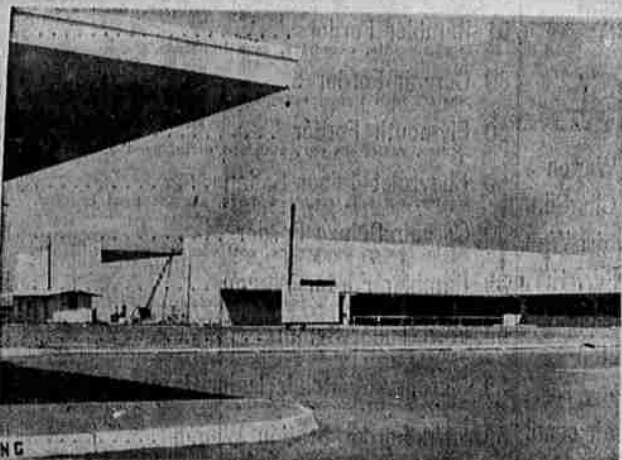
STANDARD INSURANCE BUILDING

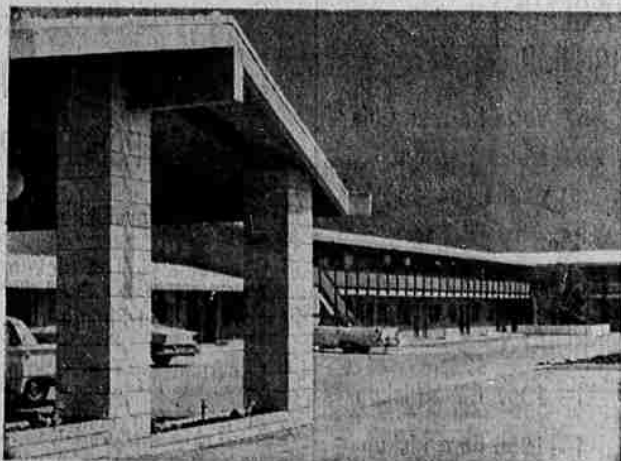
NEWBERRY'S DEPARTMENT STORE
