

Spahn Celebrates With Victory Over Pirates on 40th Birthday

Art Mahaffey and Jim Donohue have good reasons to celebrate today but even those sturdy, 22-year-old right-handers must stand in line for a slice of 40-year-old Warren Spahn's birthday cake.

For, as even Spahn himself might say, "They're a couple good young 'uns, all right, but time will tell."

Mahaffey gave the down-trodden Philadelphia Phillies something to shout about when he came within one strikeout of the all-time major league single game record by fanning 17 batters in the ninth inning of a 1-0 and 6-0 sweep of the Chicago Cubs Sunday while Donohue fanned the Detroit Tigers' early-season pennant hopes by relieving in both games of their 2-2 and 3-1 victories over the Los Angeles Angels.

Old man Spahn, meanwhile, ticked off April 23, 1981, on the calendar—his 40th birthday—with a classy seven-hit performance that earned the Milwaukee Braves a 3-1 triumph over the

Pittsburgh Pirates and Spahn the 28th victory of his career. He needs 11 more wins to become the sixth pitcher in modern history to win 300 games during his career.

Dodgers Hold First
The Los Angeles Dodgers beat the Cincinnati Reds, 5-1, to hold a half-game grip on first place and the St. Louis Cardinals scored five runs in the ninth inning to score a 7-4 decision after losing the first game of their double-header to the San Francisco Giants, 2-1, in Sunday's other National League action.

In the American league, the Baltimore Orioles beat the New York Yankees, 4-1, the Minnesota Twins edged out the Washington Senators, 1-0, the Cleveland Indians outscored the Kansas City Athletics, 10-8, and the Chicago White Sox and Boston Red Sox divided a pair, the Red Sox winning the opener, 4-3, and the White Sox taking the nightcap 7-1.

Mahaffey, a 6-1, 200-pounder from Cincinnati who had a 7-3 record and 232 earned run average for the Phillies in 1980, missed by one strikeout equalling the major league record shared by Bob Feller and Sandy Koufax. He fanned five Cubs in a row in the first and second innings and struck out the side in the second and sixth. He fanned Ernie Banks, Ron Santo, Frank Thomas and Don Zimmer three times each.

Homeless Help
The Phillies, who gave ex-Red Sox pitcher Frank Sullivan the only run he needed

when Bobby Gene Smith homered in the ninth inning of the first game, backed Mahaffey with a seven-hit attack featured by Johnny Callison's three-run fifth-inning homer. It was a big day indeed for the Phillies but they started and ended it in the same place—last place.

Donohue, a 6-3, 190-pounder from St. Louis, retired the final two batters of the first game with the bases filled and came back to gain his first major league victory in the nightcap for one inning of shutout relief. Dick Brown homered for Detroit's first run in the opener and delivered the game-winning pinch single in the 11th inning of the nightcap as the Tigers ran their winning streak to seven games. They lead second place Minnesota by a half-game in the AL.

Spahn struck out four and walked four en route to his first 1981 victory behind a 13-hit Milwaukee attack that included three hits by Johnny Demerit and two each by Roy McMillan, Ed Mathews, Hank Aaron and Wes Covington. Vern Law, major league pitcher of the year in 1980, was ripped for 10 hits in eight innings and suffered his third straight defeat of the new campaign.

McDermott Two-Baser Hurts SF

San Francisco—(UPI)—Manager Alvin Dark takes his San Francisco Giants on a 14-game road trip starting Tuesday night with the first stop slated for Los Angeles, and he could be thankful that the Dodgers don't have Mickey McDermott in the lineup.

The much-travelled pitcher, who spent most of his time in the American league, whacked a three-run double in the ninth inning Sunday to help carry the St. Louis Cardinals to a 7-4 victory over the Giants in the second game of a double header.

The blow came off Jim Duffalo and followed a 2-1 triumph which Sam Jones, with the aid of three double plays and two relief hurlers, fashioned for the Giants in the opener of the twin bill.

Extra Game Roof
Billy Loes seemed destined to go the distance in the nightcap as he sailed into the ninth inning with a 4-2 lead. If he had, it would have marked his first trip all the way since 1959 when he was at Baltimore. But Dark decided that Loes was weakening after he fed a leadoff single to Ken Boyer and then pitched two balls to Daryl Spencer.

Out went Loes, in came O'Dell and down came the roof. The Cards got one run across when first baseman Willie McCovey made a throwing error and O'Dell, who wound up the loser, was hoisted in favor of rookie Jim Duffalo.

Duffalo walked pinch hitter Alex Grammas intentionally to load the bases with one out. Then McDermott, who had fanned in the first game as a pinch swinger, got another chance and shot a two-bagger to left center which cleared the sacks.

Red Schoendienst, who opened the game with a homer off Loes, then singled in McDermott to cap the five-run frame and assure O'Dell of his first loss of the season.

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Walt Keeps Dodgers in Top Tune

Los Angeles—(UPI)—Manager Walt Alston would not let his Los Angeles Dodgers rest today although they had a bye, sending them through a morning workout to keep sharp while they await the arrival Tuesday night of the San Francisco Giants.

The Dodgers swept their three-game series with the Cincinnati Reds, capped by a 5-1 victory Sunday which featured the continuation of Walt Moon's hitting and home run streak and the excellent pitching of Roger Craig.

Moon hit his eighth homer in the fourth inning, smashing one of Cincinnati's 320 feet just past the right side of the screen in left field. It marked the 12th straight game in which Moon has hit safely. Although it was his only hit in four times at bat, it left his average at .500.

Alston said that Craig was highly effective with his slider, showed excellent control and a better fast ball than he has demonstrated previously this season.

Pender Eye On Money

Boston—(UPI)—Fractional middleweight champion Paul Pender is eyeing London—and a \$100,000 guarantee—instead of West Jordan, Utah.

The 30-year-old ex-Marine, who once had to quit boxing because of a broken hand, says a rematch with British middleweight champion Terry Downes is just about consummated.

The 15-round title fight would be held indoors, at the Wimbledon Pool. The date that Boston matchmaker Sam Silverman and British promoter Harry Levene are dickering for is July 3.

It's been open knowledge for a month that Pender would meet Downes in his next fight instead of trying again for a shot at National Boxing association champ Gene Fullmer of West Jordan, Utah.

Pender made it official Saturday night after successfully defending his share of the crown for the third time by unanimously decisioning veteran Carmen Basilio at Boston Garden.

"Fullmer?" he replied to a question about his future plans. "I might give him a shot sometime. But I want some money first and Downes has first try."

Johnson Defends

Philadelphia—(UPI)—Harold Johnson, a new champion with an old hunger, defends his National Boxing association light-heavyweight title tonight against Von Clay, a fellow Philadelphian with a big punch.

The 3-1 odds favoring Johnson reflect his confidence that the 21-year-old Clay will be his 65th victim in a 73-bout career. Why else would the champion, who has fought through 16 years, risk a bread-and-butter title just two short months after winning it?

Johnson captured the NBA version of the 175-pound title by whipping Jesse Bowdry at Miami Beach in February after the NBA had stripped Archie Moore of the crown for failing to defend in 18 months. However, Moore is still recognized as champion in New York, Massachusetts and Europe.

Clay, making a bid for the 175-pound crown in his 19th professional bout, is billed as a devastating puncher.

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
