

Laughs at Wrigley Not So Loud; Cubs Doing Well So Far

They're not laughing so loud any more at Phil Wrigley, the "poor" misguided multi-millionaire who was supposed to have gummed up the whole works for the Chicago Cubs.

"Sure it's still early yet and a lot of things can happen between now and Oct. 1, but all those experts who predicted doom for the Cubs after Wrigley introduced his "no-manager plan" can chew some of these facts awhile:

The Cubs are only 1 1/2 games out of first place.

They have, in reliever Don Elston, the pitcher with the best record in the major leagues (4-0).

And in little Don Zimmer, they have suddenly discovered not only a long-sought "uke charge" guy but also a long-bait threat with a newly found faculty for breaking up extra-inning games.

Craft Takes Over
Zimmer did just that Wednesday, enabling new manager Harry Craft to break in with a victory after taking over for Viedie Himsel in Wrigley's novel setup of using one coach as a manager for a while then another.

Zimmer picked on a three-and-two pitch with one out in the 10th inning and smashed it over the left field screen at Wrigley Field to beat the Cincinnati Reds, 3-2. Jim Maloney was the victim of Zimmer's wallop.

Only last Saturday, Zimmer brought the Cubs a 6-4 victory over the Phillies with an 11th inning homer.

Elston picked up his fourth straight victory when he took over for starter Glen Hobbie in the 10th and held the Reds hitless. Elston has appeared in five games so far and hasn't given up an earned run yet.

San Francisco retained the National League lead with a 6-5 triumph over Los Angeles, while Pittsburgh beat Philadelphia, 3-2, and Milwaukee downed St. Louis, 8-1.

In the American league, the New York Yankees ended Detroit's eight-game winning streak, 13-11, in 10 innings; Cleveland beat Baltimore, 6-3, and Washington nipped Boston, 2-1, in the only other game scheduled.

Errors by Wally Moon and Maury Wills helped the Giants to three unearned runs in a four-run eighth inning.

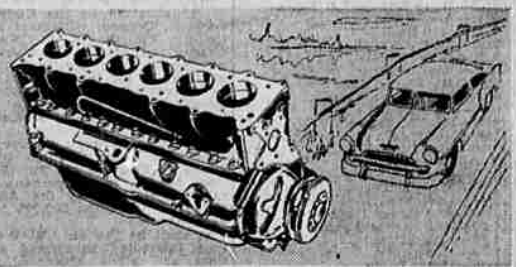

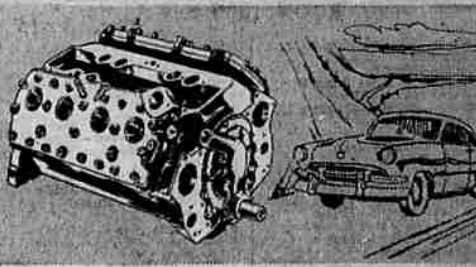
