The Medical Roundup

The Diaper Test Kit
In the last two years Diaper Test Kits, designed to detect the phenylketonuria that causes some children to become mentally deficient, have been used by 10,500 mothers of babies born in Cincinnati hospitals. The effort paid off recently when the disease was discovered in an infant, and the necessary treatment to save the child's brain from damage was immediately started. As I said in a recent column, there is a diet which does much to keep these children from getting a much injured brain. The test kit consists of small pieces of paper that are placed in the diaper shortly after the child is born. The urine-soaked papers are then mailed to a central laboratory for testing.

The Man Who Had Better See A Specialist
I get dozens of letters in which the writer says that something has gone wrong with his sight, and he wants me to prescribe some medicine or

eye-drops. Always I feel like telegraphing the person, "For Goodness sake, go immediately to a good ophthalmologist (eye specialist) who will look into your eye and examine it. Then he may be able to say what is wrong. Then he will treat you quickly and perhaps save what remains of your vision. I would be criminal if I were to do some guessing, and try to treat a possibly very serious condition—from a distance."

Often, persons write to ask me to treat their loss of hearing or pain in their ears or their serious dizziness. I appreciate the compliment, but my advice always is, "See your local ear specialist, let him examine the ear and then take his advice." Also, I never attempt to treat a skin disease by mail. That would be a foolish thing to do.
