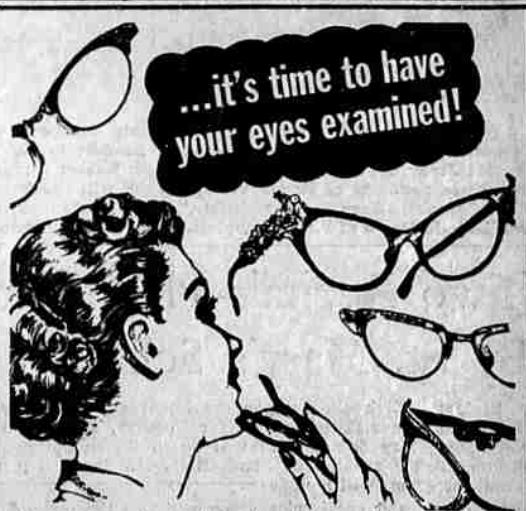
Alpha Member Attends Meeting
