Lt. Sally H. O'Connell, WAVE programs officer, Seattle, will visit the Medford Navy recruiting station Wednesday, May 3, to interview women college students and graduates. Young women interested in opportunities for appointment as officers in the Navy are invited to call at the office in the Post Office building during the day.

The Navy is currently offering commissions as ensigns to college graduates between the ages of 20 and 27 who have the "mental, moral and physical character required." For college juniors who haven't decided on a career, the Navy is offering a special summer program. An eight-week session between junior and senior year is planned as part of the WAVE officer candidate program which is completed upon graduation.
