Narcolepsy

Quite a few people who tend often to fall asleep while asking what they can do to keep awake. They say they often go to sleep even when playing cards. Some of the business men go to sleep at important business conferences. I remember the son of a big banker who was disinherited when he went sound asleep in a board meeting.

There is always the danger that a person who cannot help falling asleep will do so while driving his car. Some two-thirds of these patients sometimes have another peculiar trouble which is called cataplexy. If they get to laughing, or if they get suddenly angry or surprised, they are likely to get so weak that they may fall to the ground. The great writer Stendhal told in one of his books of once coming around a corner face to face with an actress with whom he thought he was in love. He was so flabbergasted that he almost fell down.

Some of the people with narcolepsy, when they awake from sleep, will for a short while, feel unable to move. This is called sleep paralysis. Usually, it soon passes off. A few of these persons have some hallucinations while suffering from the sleep paralysis. Narcolepsy occurs in two or three persons out of 100 in our population. Many of these victims are much helped by taking a drug of the Dextedrine type which tends to keep them awake. One drug found useful by Drs. Yoss and Daley, of the Mayo Clinic, is methylphenylate hydrochloride. Most persons have to take from 40 to 80 mg. of this every day. It is taken from 30 to 45 minutes before meals. Sometimes it causes some nervous tension, loss of appetite, and an inability to sleep at night. Hereditary shown

That this trouble can be

inherited was shown by a family studied by Drs. Yoss and Daley. In this group at least 12 members in four generations were afflicted. My experience with most of the patients I have seen is that they had some psychotic or epileptic relatives. This sort of thing has been denied by a number of writers, but I certainly have found it to be true in my cases.

For instance, one of my patients with narcolepsy had a schizophrenic and hysterical daughter, and another narcoleptic I saw suffered at times from schizophrenia herself. Another patient of mine with cataplexy used occasionally to fall out of her chair until I put her on dilantin. A man I knew who suffered from narcolepsy, even in business hours, was manic-depressive, and his mother died in a depression. A brother of my patient was a good-for-nothing drunkard, while another brother was at times manic.

I had a group of narcoleptics whose main family inheritance seemed to be an epileptic one. Thus, a man with narcolepsy had symptoms suggesting mental epilepsy. His mother was very excitable and had several alcoholic brothers, one of whom committed suicide. There was poor nervous heredity also in the man's father's side. The son of the father's brother was a sullen, irascible, solitary type of man who, from early boyhood, had always fought with everyone. The electroencephalograms of my patient showed a typically epileptic "dysrhythmia." I had a woman patient who often suffered from narcolepsy after meals. She had an epileptic sister.

A girl of 19 suffered from spells that looked like those of psychic epilepsy, and had a tendency to somnolence which kept causing her to go sound asleep in her classes at college. Her father had suffered from depressions. Another patient of mine with sleepy spells had a paternal grandfather who was insane.

The sad situation today is that most physicians will deliberately — not record what happened to the relatives of a patient with a rare disease; and the few doctors who will look at the family tend to look only for the disease the patient has; other decided diseases are disregarded. I am so untutored in psychiatry that I put down on the record everything the patient tells me about his unusual family.

My medical friends will say, "But you cannot prove anything with 10 cases." I know that perfectly well, but I say that when the same sort of disease showed up in every one of the 10 cases I studied, it is time the medical profession studied with an open mind the heredity of 100 cases. Then we might be sure.
