Lutheran Meet Planned in Medford

The annual convention of the Pacific Synod of the United Lutheran church in America will be held in Medford May 15 at Zion Lutheran church. The three-day meeting will be attended by 125 pastors and lay delegates.

Highlight of the business session will be consideration of ratification of the United Lutheran Church in America's 1960 decision to merge with Augustana Lutheran church, the American Evangelical Lutheran church, and the Finnish Lutheran church to form the new Lutheran Church in America.

The order of confirmation will be held at the Sunday 11 a.m. worship service at Zion Lutheran, Fourth and Oakdale ave. Twenty-one young people will be received into adult membership of the church.

Some of the members of the confirmation class have been selected to take part in the service. The epistle will be read by Ellen Sherman, and Catherine Watson will read the gospel for the day.

Talks will be given by Donald Thompson, who will speak on "What Confirmation Means to Me." "What My Church Means to Me" will be given by Patricia Glathair and Karen Foley, who will talk on "What Christ Means to Me."

Pastor H. C. Coover's sermon topic for the day will be "Confirmation Means Dedication."

A reception honoring the confirmands and their families will be held immediately following the service in the Fellowship hall of the parish education unit of the church.

Pastor Coover, who is a member of the board of directors of the Pacific Theological seminary, Berkeley, Calif., will leave May 8 to attend the commencement exercises there.

A goal of \$60,000 has been set for the annual Catholic Charities drive being conducted throughout the Archdiocese of Portland Sunday.

Other affiliated agencies include Blessed Martin Day nursery, Our Lady of Providence nursery, Catholic Family services, Catholic Services for children and the Catholic Youth Organization.
