

Dietetic Internship Sponsored by AF

A program of sponsored dietetic internship has been announced by the Air Force recruiting office in Portland.

Beginning July 1, graduate dietitians who have been accepted by ADA-approved hospitals for internship may be sponsored by the Air Force.

Following the 12-month internship at civilian hospitals, the dietitians are called to active duty for an additional six-month internship at specially selected AF hospitals. Courses will include the administration and management of the entire food service operation.

Checking Cars Results In Checking Accidents

Medford motorists have been asked by Police Chief Charles P. Champlin to check accidents by checking cars.

"We want to enlist the support of every local motorist in getting his car in top mechanical shape as we approach the heavy driving season," Chief Champlin said.

Chief Champlin listed the following points that motorists should check:

Brakes should take hold evenly on all wheels; hand brake should be able to hold car on any hill.

Headlights should be at correct level.

Rear and stop light as well as directional signals should operate properly.

Tires should be checked for wear and proper inflation. Wheel alignment should be

checked on reliable equipment. Windshield wipers should be checked; "dead" blades replaced.

All glass should be free of cracks or distortions; view-blocking stickers should be removed.

Rear-view mirrors should be adjusted to give clear view behind.

The chief noted that the Annual Vehicle Safety check program will be in full swing in Oregon during May and June. He said the safety check program offered every motorist a chance to make certain his car was in top shape for safe operation.

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Memorial Lectures Scheduled in City; Speakers Are Listed

Cancer of the blood and blood-forming organs and its modern treatment will be the subject of the John Tomlin Memorial Cancer lectures in Medford Wednesday and Thursday, May 10 and 11. Dr. Oscar T. Heyerman is chairman.

This type of malignant growth, widespread in the body, is best treated by a combination of X-ray therapy and tumor-destroying drugs.

Advances in techniques in these fields of medicine, and particularly in development of safer and more efficient drugs have been rapid in recent years, it was reported, and the Tomlin lectures speakers this year are three men actively engaged in this work at major treatment centers.

In Tumor Research
Dr. Laurens P. White is associated with the tumor research and treatment divisions of Children's Medical center, Boston, Mass. He will discuss pharmacology of drugs used in treating this type of disease.

Dr. Nicholas L. Petrakis, University of California Medical center, San Francisco, will discuss use of drug agents in treating leukemias and lymphomas, and will review new techniques and applications still under study.

Dr. Sydney F. Thomas, radiologist from the Palo Alto Clinic and Research foundation, California, will describe modern x-ray use.

Dinner Meeting Set

The lectures will begin at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at Rogue Valley Country club and extend through Thursday morning. A dinner meeting and scientific presentation is scheduled for Wednesday evening.

A question and answer period Thursday will permit visiting doctors to exchange views with the speakers and to obtain advice, Dr. Heyerman stated. Invitations have been sent to all medical doctors in the southern Oregon-northern California area.

This year's session is the second annual Tomlin memorial lectures, made possible through a bequest from the late John Tomlin, Medford businessman, to the Oregon division of the American Cancer Society for the advancement of professional education for the region's doctors.
