

Oregon Withdraws Support of CICC

Portland — (UPI) — State Finance Director Freeman Holmer said Friday that Oregon was withdrawing its financial support from the Columbia Interstate Compact commission.

He made the statement at a commission meeting here. Holmer also told CICC representatives that Oregon was not going to continue negotiations for the seven-state development of the Columbia river.
