The Medical Roundup

General Practitioners Perform Most Operations

Professor L. S. Ravdin, of the University of Pennsylvania has announced as follows:

extensive practice of surgery by general practitioners.

Dr. Ravdin said that 60 per cent of the operations now being performed in this country are done by men who have not limited their practice to surgery.

The doctor questioned the wisdom of licensing every graduate of a medical school as a "Physician and Surgeon."

Certainly, in my case, he is right. I am licensed by three states to practice surgery, and hence, so far as the law is concerned, I could tomorrow go into a hospital with a patient and say, "I am going to remove a tumor from this man's brain." Fortunately, I have sense enough to know that before attempting such an operation I ought to study under an able brain surgeon for perhaps five years.

Fortunately, also, in a well-run hospital, a man like me is not allowed to operate. The Board in charge would check up on my training and would find that although I graduated from a good medical school and had an excellent internship in medicine, I had so poor an internship in surgery that I never even assisted at an operation. When the professors of surgery came in the mornings to operate, each man brought his usual assistant with him, and hence all I ever did at an operation was to hang onto a retractor — to keep the wound open.

Much Argument

In recent years there has been much argument in hospitals as to who should be allowed to operate and who had better be denied the privilege. I have discussed this problem with many friends who are general practitioners, and I think they are right in contending that a man like me should never be allowed to operate. But a man who, perhaps, after years of excellent training in surgery, elects

to go into a small city, perhaps in a sparsely settled mountainous district, should be doing much of the surgery needed in that community. In doing it, he will be a very useful citizen.

In many hospitals in big cities there is still much argument as to the logic of letting a general practitioner do certain operations, but not others. To illustrate, many years ago one of my very good friends was one of the ablest general practitioners in a small city in central California. Later, after graduate study at Harvard, he moved to a big city and became one of the best pediatricians in the state. For a while he had much argument with nose and throat men and surgeons because he could not see why he should not go on removing tonsils and acute appendices from children. For years he had done this sort of work and done it well.

Sometimes Doesn't Work

He would never have thought of trying to remove a gallbladder or a stomach ulcer. I think eventually the authorities in the hospital in which he worked granted him the right to do the few operations he had for long been accustomed to perform. As some surgeons say, the only trouble with this system is that it does not work in some poorly-run hospitals in which anything goes, and where a man can remove a woman's womb even though he is so unskilled that he takes four hours to do a job that a surgeon would finish in perhaps 45 minutes.
