The shape of things to come in the interim between this 1961 and the next 1963 legislatures was becoming clearer on three major fronts as this second-longest session in Oregon's history closed.

The fronts of future activity resulting from actions in this session are: (1) ballot measures by which the Legislature will pass on to the voters in the 1962 the responsibility to make a decision; (2) legislative interim committees which will work out possible programs for action by the next Legislature; and (3) politics leading up to the 1962 election.

Ballot Measures

Measures on which citizens may be called upon to vote include: Daylight saving time; a House-passed bill to remove the \$600-a-year limit on legislative pay, legislative reapportionment, Sen. Robert Straub's F.A.I.R. bill (full auto insurance responsibility) which amounts to compulsory auto insurance, and a Senate-passed proposal providing that if a sales tax ever is enacted in the future it will be for no more than three per cent and revenues would be earmarked for schools in order to offset property taxes.

Backed by Senator Walter Pearson, the sales tax measure has been termed a "cruel hoax" by Sen. Monroe Sweetland and "a property tax carrot on a sales tax trap" by Sen. Alfred Corbett. All of them are Democratic senators, illustrating again the intra-party split that has caused so much trouble during this session.

The House is not likely to pass this bill, but there would still be a possibility of an initiative referendum by sales tax supporters who think Oregon citizens (who have turned down a sales tax at least a half dozen times in the past) may now be ready to vote in favor of one if they thought it would mean less property taxes.

Interim Committees

Eight interim committees, costing a total of \$195,000, probably will be at work between sessions, despite efforts in Ways and Means Committee to cut out all but an interim committee to rewrite Oregon's awkward and outdated Constitution.

Areas for interim study include the traditional ones of agriculture, education, and highways, plus public employees retirement, small business and fair trade (where the trading stamp issue again may be discussed), local government, and constitutional revision.

As usual, members of these committees will be appointed by the Senate President and the Speaker of the House, plus, possibly, the governor. The original bill for the constitutional revision interim committee specified that it should include all of Oregon's living former governors, Republicans Charles A. Sprague, John Hall and Elmo Smith, and Democrat Robert D. Holmes.

However, some legislators

felt this would amount to an unfair percentage of Republicans. There was general agreement that Sprague and Holmes would be likely to contribute the most to the interim study since both had already served on Gov. Hatfield's government reorganization committee.

Must Be Elected

So Ex-Govs. Hall and Smith tactfully were excluded by a specification that the former governors serving on the committee must have been elected governors. (Hall and Smith both became governors by succession after deaths of the previous governors; Sprague and Holmes both won office by vote of the people.)

Rep. Grace Peck (D-Portland) made a valiant but unsuccessful fight to get Ways and Means to approve a ninth interim committee—this to deal with problems of welfare, divorce, health and sex offenders.

Since all of the above problems are ones with which the state's social workers must contend as part of their day-to-day professional duties, it is possible that in the absence of an interim committee to write proposed laws in those areas the social workers will propose some measures themselves through their statewide organization. That would follow the established practice of other special interest groups (teachers, timber companies, farmers, etc.) who have been fairly adept at writing their own laws and then getting the Legislature to pass them.

Actually, the usefulness of interim committees has been called into question in view of the fact that a great deal of state time and money was spent for the previous session's interim studies and sometimes elaborate printed reports by eight committees, and no one knows yet how much of that was justified by legislation which reached the final stage of becoming law.

It is too late for this session, but a future Legislature may decide that \$195,000 might be better spent on a year-round professionally-staffed Legislative Research Committee assigned to dig up facts about specific problems now turned over to part-time interim committees made up of legislators (who must be paid extra for their travel and living expenses while attending interim committee meetings). Most of the fact-finding work of interim committees is done by well-paid lawyers and other professional personnel anyway.

Unofficial opening gun of the 1962 gubernatorial campaign was fired by Gov. Hatfield at a "Let's Face It" television panel program moderated by Former Gov. Holmes last week.

Hatfield called the Legislative Fiscal Office a "farce" and indicated his low opinion of the Legislature's work, especially Ways and Means appropriations, thus far.

Legislators were quick to rise to the defense of their

fiscal officer Kenneth Bragg and of the Ways and Means Committee. Bragg received a standing ovation by Ways and Means members at a committee meeting—a rare demonstration of respect for a dedicated public servant and a rare show of unity by Ways and Means members who had fought amongst themselves so bitterly that House members once walked out of the room.

Saving Claimed

Senator Corbett pointed out that Bragg's work had saved the state well over a million dollars. "I don't think it's a farce to save the taxpayers that much money," said the Portland Democrat.

And Ways and Means Chairman Dan Thiel (D-Astoria) on the floor of the Senate defended his committee's appropriations point by point in comparison with the governor's budget.

This is a dispute that Oregonians will hear debated from now until November, 1962.

Hatfield is going to blame the Democratic-controlled Legislature for all the state's woes and the government's shortcomings. He will be in a position to take the offensive, declaring that the unresolved struggle between the liberal and the conservative Democrats stalled constructive legislative action on vital issues.

He will say the Legislators were more solicitous of their own pocketbooks (voting themselves expense checks and trying again to get salary raises) than of the taxpayers.

He will profess dismay and disgust at the "spectacle of private feuds and personal antagonisms having a life and death effect on legislation" (to quote GOP State Chairman Robert G. Davis)—referring to the blow-up between Sen. Pearson and House Speaker Robert G. Duncan during the three-way workmen's compensation compromise meeting where Pearson accused Duncan of "double-crossing" because members of the press were present. (Fact is, the press heard about the compromise meeting through another third party, a representative who doesn't believe in keeping secrets from the press or the people. Duncan was innocent of the charge.)

Able To Accuse

Furthermore, Hatfield—a master of the look-em-straight-in-the-eyes and use-the-sincere-timbro-in-the-voice technique—will be able to accuse the Legislature both of reckless spending and of penny-pinching while he declares that his budget was more sensible than the one ultimately passed by the Legislature.

The governor will claim credit for any industrial development (and new payrolls) that comes as a result of the Boardman lease to Boeing, the oil leases, the paper plant easements, and so on—which all required legislative cooperation.

Legislative leadership, deeply split and harassed by self-doubts, will be on the defensive, trying to justify their actions and appropriations against Hatfield's self-confident charges. They'll have to explain every cent they spent. And why they didn't spend more.

They'll try to put the egg back in Hatfield's pocket. So Oregonians can expect to hear a great deal more about the 1961 Legislature beyond the first post-mortem that will begin this week after sine die adjournment.

P.S.—As another prelude to the 1962 election, Oregonians may as well begin to brace themselves for more and more discussion of international affairs by Gov. Hatfield. At a recent press conference, the governor refused to comment on the Cuban situation, explaining that he was so preoccupied with state and legislative business that he did not have time to develop opinions on international affairs. But Hatfield and his chief political advisor, Travis Cross, are well aware that the governor's main weakness as a possible national figure is his lack of "Weltanschauung". So we are seeing signs that the governor is going to try to move into a wider field; he has released a "demand" that President Kennedy ask the Soviets for "proof" of their man-in-space achievement.

Leadership Said Lacking in Salem

Salem—(UPI)—A lobbyist for social welfare legislation told the Oregon Social Welfare Conference Monday the 1961 legislature has been without "real leadership" and that "liberal legislation" has had rough going.

Kenneth Gervais of Portland called the current legislation a "real negative session."

Gervais also criticized Gov. Mark Hatfield. He said Hatfield has been "of little or no use except in creating publicity with his attacks on various organizations."

He also criticized Senate President Harry Bolvin, House Speaker Robert Duncan, and others.

Nixon Criticizes Censorship Appeal

Detroit—(UPI)—Former Vice President Richard M. Nixon Tuesday criticized President Kennedy's recent appeal for "self-censorship" by the press and said "the plea of security could well become a cloak" for errors and failures by the administration.

Nixon said "the kindest judgment that can be made about this scheme" is that it was obviously "not thought through by the White House staff."

He charged that the whole idea of a return to secrecy in peacetime "demonstrates a profound misunderstanding of the role of a free press as opposed to that of a controlled press."
