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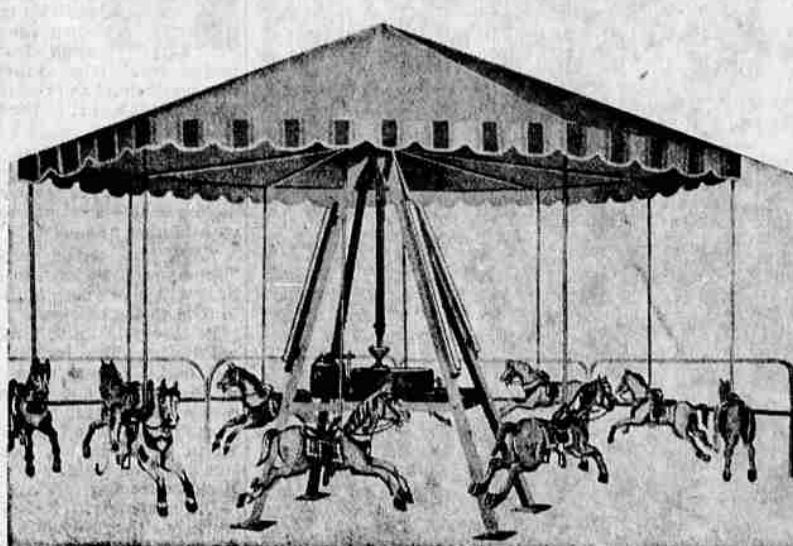

Photo-Flash Type Light for Planes Winning Favor

Washington—UPI—The airlines are taking a long, hard look at a revolutionary new type of aircraft lighting that might have prevented the collision of two airliners over New York last December.

It was invented by a Northwest Orient Airlines pilot named Bill Atkins who got the idea while taking a flashbulb picture from his cockpit. The light was so bright, Atkins began wondering if this "flash" technique couldn't be adapted to aircraft exterior lighting.

From that simple beginning came the Atkins-Honeywell Maximum Safety Light, regarded by many aviation experts as the best exterior lighting ever developed for airplanes and a definite weapon against air collisions.

The system involves two pods mounted in each wing tip. There are three white strobe lights in a pod—one flashes to the side and the third flashes to the rear.

Resembles Strobe

Each light, which resembles an ordinary photographer's strobe light flashes at a different rate. There are 160 bursts of light per minute flashing forward, 80 per minute sideways and 40 per minute rearward.

A pilot seeing such lights would be able to tell which way the other plane was going—whether it was coming toward him head-on, approaching him from one side or whether he was overtaking it. This is not possible with existing lights.

Originally, Atkins designed the system for night use. But his lights are so powerful they also can be used in daylight. At night they can be seen from 35 to 50 miles away—triple the range of present aircraft lighting. In daylight, they can be seen from three to 15 miles away—even in fog, haze, smoke or snow.

Pilots have reported seeing the Atkins lights several minutes before they saw the actual plane. On one test, the lights were visible nearly nine miles from a control tower which didn't see the plane until it was only four miles away.

Atkins himself, a crew-cut pilot with 14,000 hours in the air, believes if the United jet involved in a collision with a Trans World Airlines Constellation over New York had been equipped with his lights, "the TWA pilot would have had better than a 50 per cent chance of avoiding the collision."

"He had been alerted that there was traffic coming toward him," Atkins recalled. "He would have seen our lights in sufficient time to take evasive action."

Atkins designed his system in 1958 and approached the Minneapolis Honeywell Co. with his concept. Honeywell tested the lights and contracted to mass-produce them.

Approved System

There are only about 40 aircraft equipped with the Atkins-Honeywell lights at present, including Northwest planes. But the Federal Aviation Agency has approved the system, and its adoption is expected to mushroom.

Two major aircraft manufacturers are planning to install the lights on new jets at the factories. Several major airlines also have contracted for installation on their fastest planes.

The system costs about \$1,600 for a DC3 and up to \$3,000 for installation on a jetliner. But Atkins pointed out that the cost of one collision could pay for installation on an entire fleet.
