Second Russian Space Flight Seen

Vienna—UPI—A second Soviet manned space flight, possibly by two or more astronauts, will take place soon, Radio Warsaw predicted today.

Radio Warsaw said its information was based on predictions by "Moscow scientific circles."

According to Soviet scientific experts, the broadcast said, the new flight will be much more advanced technically and scientifically than the first one.

One of the astronauts to make the trip would probably be Maj. Yuri Gagarin, since he was the only Soviet citizen who has had practical experience in space, the broadcast added.

France Suspends Gagarin Invitation

Paris—UPI—France today suspended an invitation to Soviet spaceman Yuri Gagarin after it had been reported that he would arrive the same day as President Kennedy.

Officials of the Union Syndicale des Industries Aeronautiques, which will stage the 24th Paris Air Show beginning May 28, announced the suspension of its invitation to Gagarin to attend the show.

The union declined to comment on the reason.

Informed sources said, however, the French had informed the Soviets that available forces might not be sufficient to guarantee the security of President Kennedy and the world's first spaceman at the same time.

Founder of Dental Clinic at Veterans Domiciliary Dies

White City—Dr. Arthur R. Schoenberg, 63, chief of dental services at the Veterans Administration domiciliary, died early Tuesday morning, May 9, in a Medford hospital.

Dr. Schoenberg established the dental services at the White City installation in January, 1949. He remained as its chief until his death.

He had attended a meeting Monday evening of the Veterans Administration Volunteer Services in which he took a keen interest as a supplement to the VA's medical and rehabilitation programs for disabled veterans. He also was a disabled veteran.

He served in World War I and II; first as a private from Nebraska in 1918 and later as chief, operative dentistry, 218th general hospital, U.S. Army, from Sept. 4, 1942 until Feb. 5, 1946.

Nebraska Graduate
Dr. Schoenberg was born Feb. 17, 1898, at Milford, Neb. He attended public schools there and was graduated from the college of dentistry, University of Nebraska in June, 1923. He was a member of Delta Sigma Delta fraternity.

From Aug. 31, 1946, until Jan. 9, 1947, he was on the regional office dental staff at Portland. He was senior dental officer at the Salem, Ore., VA office from Feb. 10, 1947, until Jan. 8, 1949.

During the years 1923 to 1942, he practiced in Nebraska where he was a 32nd Degree Mason and a Past Worshipful Master of his lodge.

Dr. Schoenberg enjoyed the Rogue River Valley and his interest and activities in fishing and hunting were well known among his associates and numerous friends throughout the region.

He is survived by his wife, Myrtle E. Schoenberg, White City, a son, Richard Arthur, Caracas, Venezuela, who arrived Thursday, and three grandsons.

China Describes 'Calamity' Wave

Tokyo—UPI—Communist China today described a wave of widespread "natural calamities," thus laying the groundwork for announcing its third successive crop failure.

The New China news agency issued a gloom report of drought, hail, high winds, snowstorms and predicted flooding over broad areas of the China mainland.

"Some farms have reported complete crop failure," it said of conditions in coastal Shantung. Newly planted seedlings and wheat sown last winter had been snuffed out by nature, it said.

Massive crop failures, attributed to natural calamities, have left China in near famine.

State Employees Get Pay Increases

Salem—UPI—The Oregon Civil Service Commission has approved pay scales for more than 15,000 unclassified state employees with only minor changes over earlier recommendations.

The legislature allocated about \$7.7 million in state salary increases, not counting higher education.

Allan S. Kahn, supervisor of the commission's pay and research division, said teachers at state institutions won slightly higher salaries compared to the previous plan. He said this is "in accordance with legislative intent to keep them reasonably on a par with Salem public school teachers and others."

Water in Hams Hearing Topic

Portland—UPI—Conflicting testimony was heard here Thursday at a U.S. Department of Agriculture hearing on a federal regulation that allows packers to add up to 10 per cent water to hams.

Dr. M. L. Houston, state supervisor of the meat industry for the Oregon Department of Agriculture said "Housewives prefer to get the water to plump up smoked hams out of a tap and not pay ham prices for it."

American Meat Institute representatives defended the water addition and said surveys show that "A majority of American housewives prefer smoked hams that are juicier, more tender and less salty than their mothers served."

Twenty witnesses appeared at the hearing and a majority of them opposed the 1960 amendment to the USDA meat inspection regulations that allows the sale weight of cured hams to exceed the "green" weight before curing by 10 per cent.

The Portland hearing was the sixth in a series of eight throughout the U.S. The hearings were requested by Sen. Maurine Neuberger (D-Ore.).
