

Tornado Diamonders Down Grants Pass

Medford high's Black Tornado diamond crew, spurred offensively by the two for two hitting of three men while its three pitchers were holding the opposition to seven hits, wrote up its fifth Southern Oregon conference victory yesterday by outlasting Grants Pass here 8 to 6.

The Tornadoes ran up a six-point 8 to 2 margin in the seventh inning of the game, weathered a flareup of misuses in the seventh inning to preserve the win.

Sam Knudsen, Craig Laurance and Bob Schroeder were the two for two swatters. Knudsen and Laurance each tripped. They knocked in two runs each and Schroeder pushed home three, one on a sacrifice flyout.

Errors allowed in four of the GP runs. The Cavemen collected three of their seven hits off Medford's Herb Wheeler and two each off Bob Quinney and Stewart Young. The game represented Medford's only varsity baseball day of the week. It put the Tornado ahead of league-pacing Klamath Falls in the win column but Medford has one more loss than the Pelicans. Grants Pass was left in the cellar alone.

Games Saturday

Weather permitting, Klamath Falls and Ashland were to make up a league scrap at Ashland this afternoon. Two varsity doublebills are on the Saturday agenda. Ashland is to meet Crater at Central Point and Klamath is to travel to Grants Pass. Only the first games in each case count in the conference standings.

Grants Pass's first man to hit, Gary Holmes, tallied the first run of the conflict yesterday. He singled and Jack Sakraida sacrificed him to second base. Holmes went to third after the catch of Mike Lilleman's right field foul out and came home on an error on Steve Haunts' ground ball. Medford got two counters in the second canto when GP starting touser Paul Blinks gave up a single to Schroeder and walked three men and hit batter. Four more were chalked up in the third stanza on back to back triples by Knudsen and Laurance, sin-

Gun Club Conducts Annual Trapshoot

It's two big days and one evening of trapshooting at Medford Gun Club this Saturday and Sunday.

The occasion is the 28th annual Mail Tribune tournament. A program of 500 targets, 30 of them under Pacific International Trapshooting Association registration, will be offered Saturday morning.

The tourney will open with 100-target 16 yard affair at 8 a.m. Saturday. It is the Rogue Valley Hundred with trophies for A, B, C and D classes. At 3 p.m. Saturday will be the 100-bird Chester Food handicap with a perpetual purse to be allotted on the first 50 pigeons. Trophies will go to the first three places. Other prizes include flies, wrist watches, a jet-sander, a portable radio, an electric fry pan and an electric toaster.

A non-registered 50-bird handicap will be fired at 8 a.m. Saturday. The event for which the tourney is named is set for 9 a.m. Sunday. Gunners will be firing at 100 targets at 10 yards for the Mail Tribune trophy. There will be trophies in four classes, for junior, sub-junior, high lady and veteran and 65 and over. The endall trophy will go to a high gunner in B class or over.
