Bids Opened for County Equipment

The Jackson county court accepted two groups of bids on county road department equipment this morning but referred the bids to the county engineer for a check on specifications submitted.

County Engineer Robert Carstensen said he would make recommendations to the county court so it can award the contracts Wednesday.

Bids considered for a front-end loader included Loggers and Contractors Equipment company, Portland, \$17,285.38; Howard Cooper company, Central Point, \$19,097. alternate bid, \$19,497; Cramer Machinery company, Portland, \$21,148.30, with diesel \$21,598.30; or second alternate, \$20,768.31; Hauptert, Tractor company, Medford, \$17,910; Crater Lake Machinery, \$21,115.

Bids submitted for a 10 to 12 ton three wheel roller included Howard Cooper corporation, \$12,345.97; Cramer Machinery company, Portland, \$15,054; Balzer Machinery company, Portland, \$9,342, alternate bid, \$9,492; Air-mac Inc., Portland, \$9,583; Feenaughy company, Portland, \$9,991; and Cal-Ore Machinery company, Medford, \$9,385.

Wednesday, the county court awarded a contract of \$5,531 to Delegh Motors, Medford, for two three-quarter ton pickup trucks. Earlier the county court had awarded a contract for \$15,000 to Nelson Equipment company, Portland, for two scooped vehicles.

RR Times Sold To Florence Man

Rogue River - The Rogue River Times, a weekly newspaper started Nov. 2, 1951, has been sold by its founders and owners, Maxwell and Marcia Thayer to Wayne Morgan, Florence, Ore.

Morgan, who with two brothers published a newspaper in Florence until it was sold last December, will be assisted by his brother, Leland.

The Thayers own a farm on Footh Creek rd. where they plan to retire. They are working with the Morgans to acquaint them with the Times' operation. The newspaper, the first offset newspaper in Oregon, publishes every Thursday with a circulation of about 1,000 mainly in Jackson and Josephine counties.

Among the awards which the Times has received was a National Editorial association award in 1956 for the best news story for weeklies under 2,000 circulation. The story was about the severe flood in the valley.

Thayer told the Mail Tribune today that he understood that the newspaper's operation will continue to be basically the same. At present there are two employees in addition to the Thayers. The Morgans will publish their first edition June 2.

Prior to coming to the Rogue valley in 1951, Thayer was employed by the Hearst organization in California.

More Discussion Set on Jail Farm
Sheriff Joe Walsh and District Court Judge L. L. Sawyer will meet with the county court this afternoon to discuss further a proposed county jail farm.

Walsh said the site selected, if the proposal is agreeable to the county court, will depend on the facilities and equipment available.

Yesterday afternoon Walsh and Sawyer inspected the old agronomy station at Talent and the former horticultural experiment station south of Phoenix with District Attorney Alan Holmes and County Commissioner Edwin Taylor.

Based on general observations, Walsh said he would prefer the horticultural property. He noted that the old agronomy station of approximately 47 acres includes some farm equipment housed in one of the sheds. The old horticultural station contains 19 or 20 acres under crops. The remainder of the 27 acres is creek bottom river wash rock.

Walsh estimated that through operation of a prisoner farm he can reduce the meal costs per prisoner to 11 1/2 cents each.

Race Driver Killed At Indianapolis
Indianapolis, Ind. - Tony Bettenhausen, 44, Tinley Park, Ill., twice national driving champion, was killed today in a practice run at the Indianapolis Speedway.

Bettenhausen was testing the car for his friend, Paul Russo, Fortville, Ind.

Bettenhausen crashed through the inside retaining wall at the end of the home stretch. Hundreds of spectators and race officials were near the site.

The race car hurdled the wall and crashed through a wire fence, landing in the first few rows of seats. The seats were unoccupied.

'K' Voices Need For Coexistence
Moscow - Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev said today he wants to get along with the Kennedy administration despite differences of views on social and political questions.

Stressing the need for peaceful coexistence in a world living in the shadow of nuclear weapons, the Communist leader said:

"Taking a realistic view, we have to live on the same planet, and we have to find solutions. We are ready to build up our relations with any country to safeguard peace throughout the world."

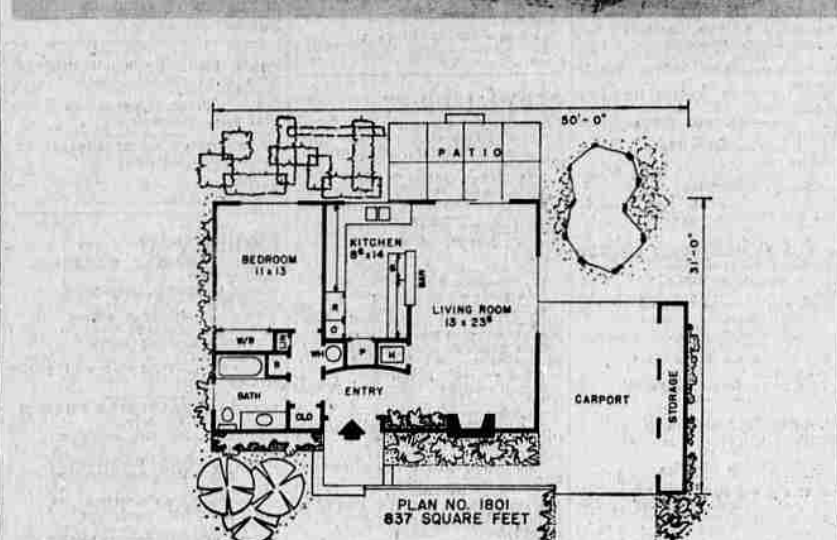
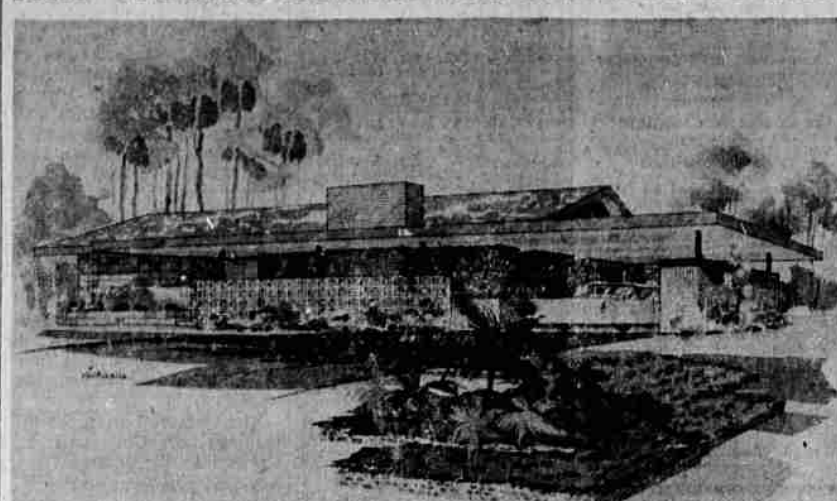
Ex-Medford Man Dies Near Weed

This Week's Ranch and Modern Home

For young married couples that are just beginning married life or for retired couples living alone once again, here is a home that although small in size is livable on a scale that cannot be measured in square footage. Its appearance makes it look far more expensive than it actually is. Inside, the room arrangement is the essence of efficiency.

The flat roof covering the carport is supported by round metal posts which extend up through the long storage closet. This flat roof extends around the front of the living room wall to provide a covered passage from the carport to the front door. A concrete block screen wall is next to this walk. Further design interest has been obtained by using concrete block for veneer and a planter at the front of the bath wall and again on the wide chimney.

Open to Wide Entry
Double doors open to a wide entry. A curved wall at the rear of the entry adds considerable distinction to this home. Another design feature is the planter which extends from the entry to the fireplace.

Both the water heater and furnace have been placed in closets formed by the curved entry wall. A guest closet, broom and linen are off the hall. The wardrobe in the bedroom has drawers at the bottom which adds to the general storage area. The bath features a tub with shower over and a pullman lavatory.
