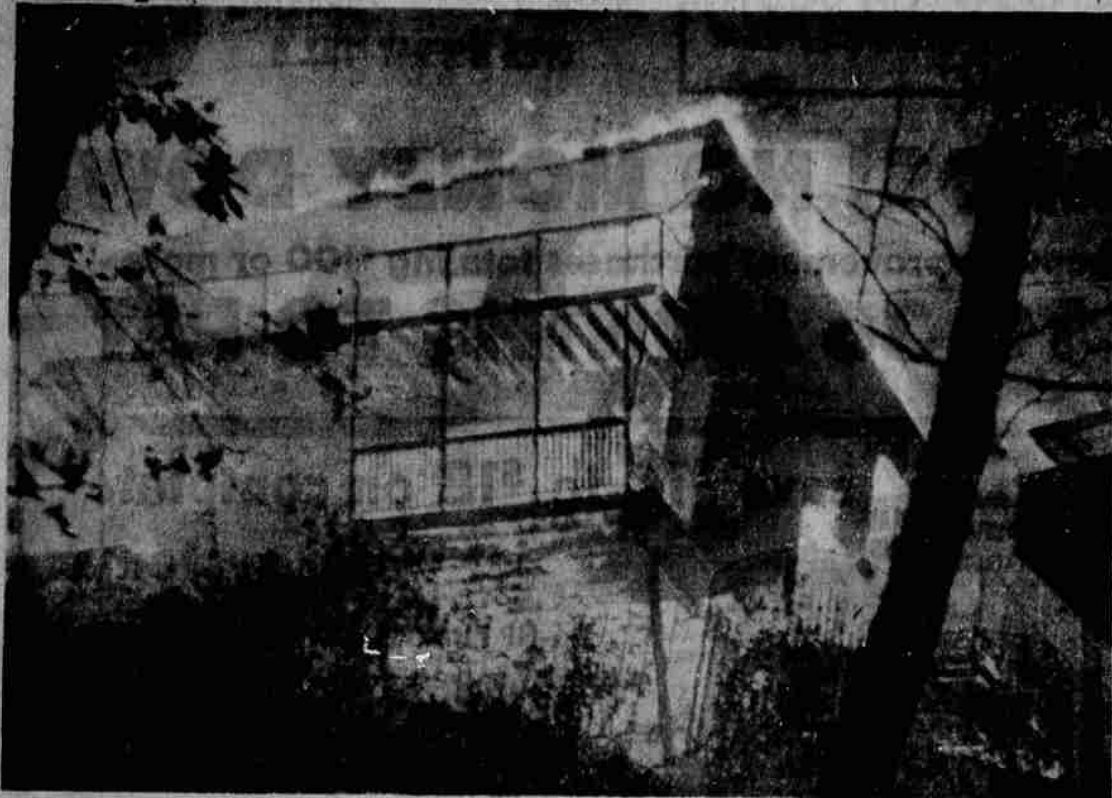
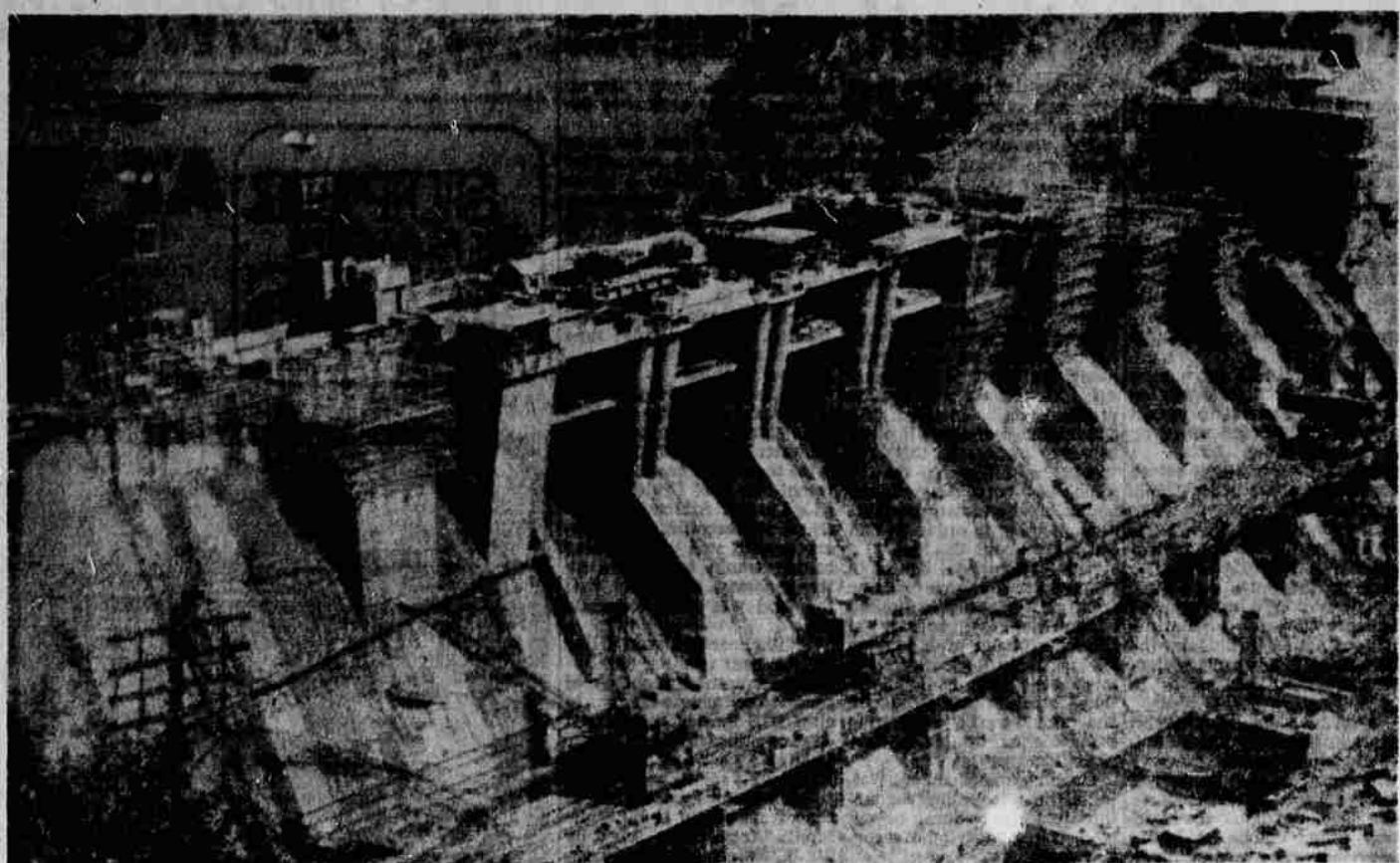


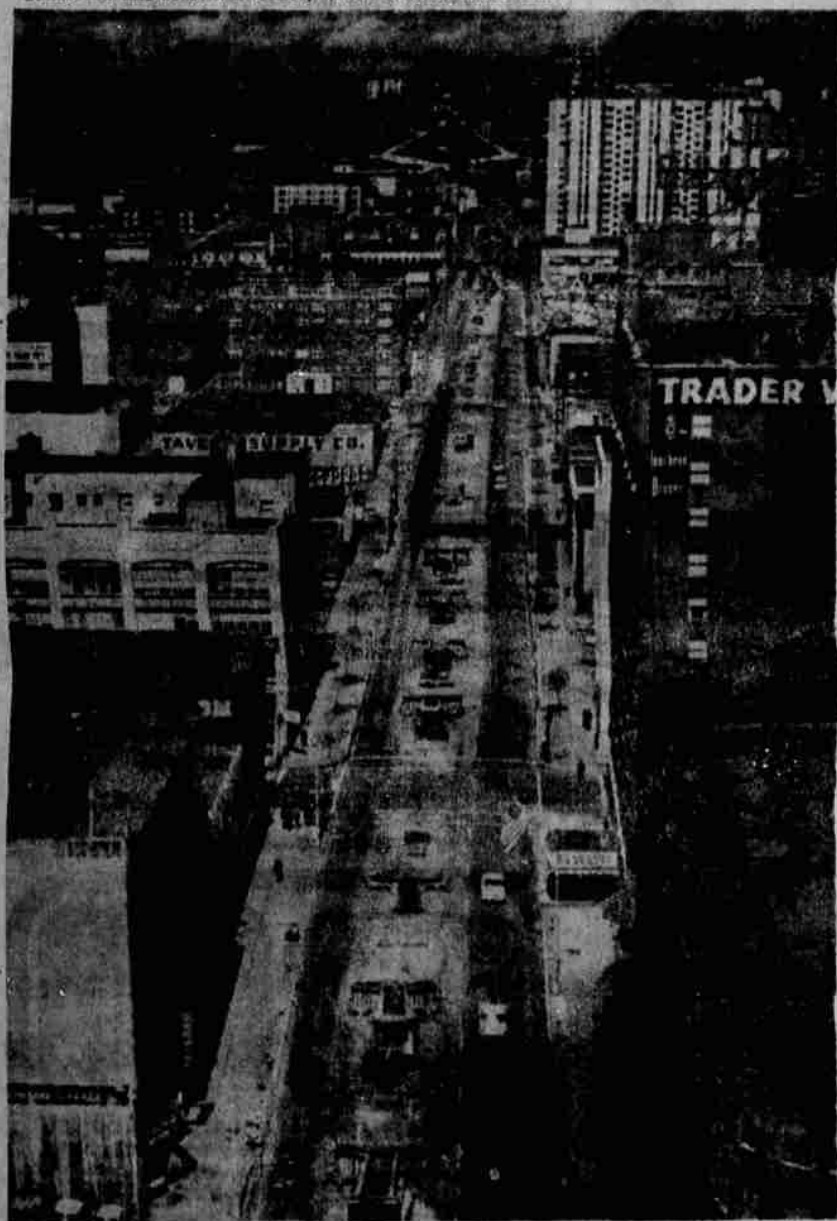
Ships, Fire, Water And Construction Are Picture Subjects



BRUSH FIRE BURNS HOMES—A giant brush fire, fanned by 40-mile-an-hour winds, consumes a house in the Hollywood Hills area in the first major brush fire of southern California this season. The fire, which covered more than 1,400 acres, forced hundreds of people to flee their homes. At least 29 homes, including the home of Novelist Aldous Huxley, have been destroyed or damaged. PROJECT TROUBLE—At least two of Communist China's major industrial development projects are in serious trouble because of Russia's failure to deliver promised equipment, according to reputable Japanese business sources in Tokyo. The sources said the two projects known to be affected by non-delivery equipment are a hydro-electric development program along the Yellow river, including the huge Sanmen Gorge dam and hydro-electric project, and a shipbuilding program in several northeastern port cities. This picture from official Communist source (filed in May, 1960) shows construction of dam for Sinkiang power station in Chekiang Province in Red China. It is claimed to be the first hydro-electric power station designed by Communist Chinese engineers and equipped with Chinese-built machinery. (UPI Telephoto)



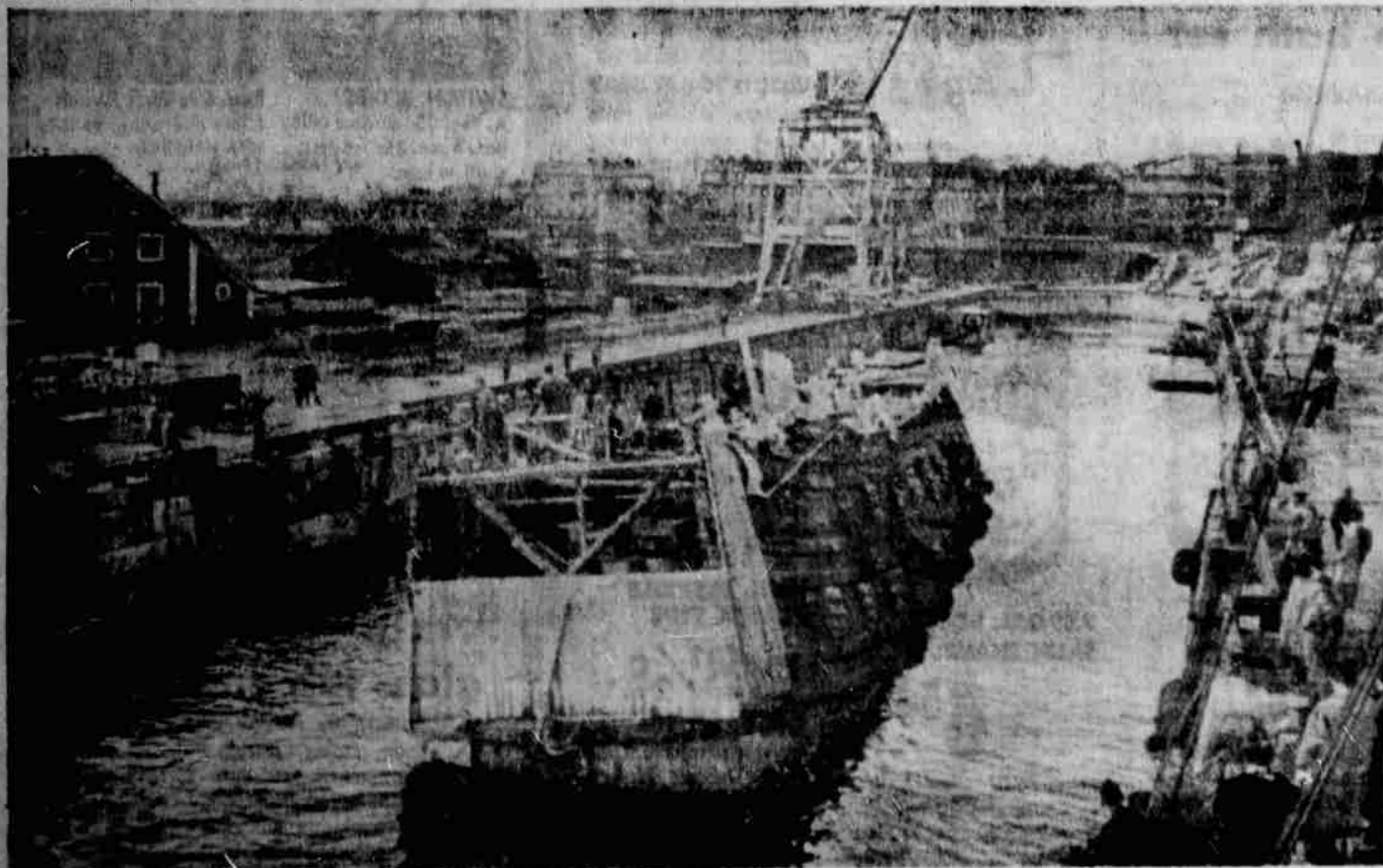
