Attendance yesterday at the annual gem and mineral show sponsored by the Roxy Ann Gem and Mineral club, Medford, was "very good," according to Leland A. Mentzer, president of the local club.

The two-day show began yesterday at the Medford Armory, Highway 99 south of Medford. Exhibits will be on display between 10 o'clock this morning and 6 o'clock this afternoon.
