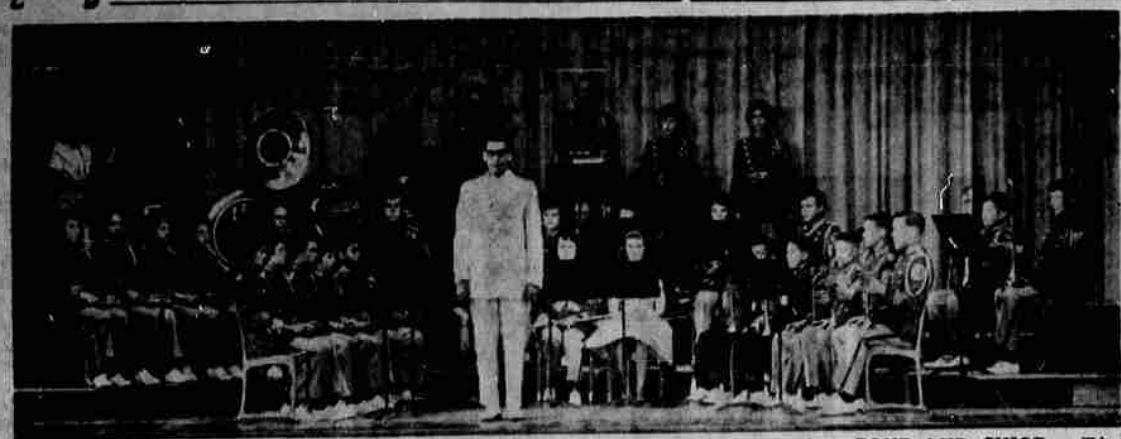




Happy Camp PTA Makes Life Membership Presentation

More Arrests May Be Made in Hoop Point Fix Scandal

Raleigh, N.C. - Dozens of basketball "fixing" indictments may result from a mushrooming investigation which led to the arrests of three North Carolina State college players.

Speculation even linked the North Carolina point trimming scandal with one uncovered recently in New York.

The NC State athletic department initiated the long investigation which led to the arrests of Wolfpack captain Stan Niewierowski, guard Antonio Muehlbauer and 6-9 center Terry Litchfield Saturday.

Muehlbauer and Litchfield waived preliminary hearing and will be tried June 5 in Wake county superior court.

Also charged in the case was Lou Barshak of New York, a Los Angeles State player described as the contact man in the conspiracy. Los Angeles police were asked to hold him for extradition.

Ends of More Arrests

The state bureau of investigation has not said outright that more warrants will be issued. But SBI Director Walter Anderson has hinted several times that more arrests may be made in the near future. His department is now pressing even deeper into the case.

Anderson said Sunday he received a telegram from the New York City District Attorney's office saying Niewierowski was being held there as a "material witness."

Hornbrook - Miss Phyllis Bird has been notified of her acceptance as assistant program director at Our Cabana, Cuernavaca, Morelos, Mexico, for the three months beginning June 1. Our Cabana is a residential center owned and operated by the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts. It is not a camp. The Cabana is open to girls from all around the world who come from member nations of the World Association. It was built and is maintained by the contributions of many people. There are three dormitories, each equipped to accommodate 16 girls and two adults.

Cultural Program

Located 47 miles from Mexico City and two miles from the center of Cuernavaca, Our Cabana offers a cultural program which includes sightseeing to historical places, hand arts, singing and dancing, and special Girl Scout activities. Flag ceremonies, campfires and swimming are part of the daily program. Registration is open to all Girl Scouts 15 years of age and older.

Miss Bird's duties will be to assist in carrying out the program of the six-day sessions, under the supervision of the guides in charge.

Groups of girls from the entire Western hemisphere have been registered for the 1981 summer sessions.

Since September, 1980, Miss Bird has been the first and second grade teacher in the local elementary school. Her experience in Girl Scouts includes membership in troops in Utah and Pennsylvania, and she was instrumen-

Siskiyou School Chief Named College President

Yreka - W. E. Roberts, Siskiyou county superintendent of schools, has announced he will resign from the county school system to accept the presidency of College of the Siskiyou in Weed.

Roberts said today he will assume his new duties July 1. He will replace the late Dr. M. J. Greenfields.

Roberts has been a Siskiyou county resident most of his life. He was born and raised in Dunsuir. He is a graduate of San Jose State. Prior to becoming county superintendent in 1951, he taught in Dunsuir schools and was district superintendent in Weed.

Roberts, 50, is married. He and his wife have two daughters.
