Wright-Fernandez Bout Tops Week's Schedule

New York - (UPI) - A nationally televised welter-weight contenders' fight between Ted Wright of Detroit and Jorge Fernandez of Argentina at St. Nicholas Arena Saturday night tops this week's boxing schedule.

Each is fresh from an impressive victory in the same arena. Wright gave highly touted Federico Thompson of Argentina a thorough licking, and Fernandez upset Denny Moyer.

Those victories boosted Wright and Fernandez in the ratings. Wright now is ranked third by the National Boxing association and eighth by Ring magazine. Stubby Fernandez is rated fourth by the Ring and fifth by NBA.

Harder Hitter Fernandez is favored at 8-5 because he apparently is the harder hitter, particularly with his left hook. But Wright is a good puncher too and perhaps the smarter boxer.

At Caracas, Venezuela, Friday night, Sadio Yacola of Japan, the top-rated flyweight contender, engages fourth-rated Ramon Arias, champion of Venezuela.

NBA Stars May Get Pensions

New York - (UPI) - National Basketball association players, who have considered themselves orphans in professional sports because they lacked a pension plan, were ready to start a "share the wealth" program today with NBA owners.

Under an agreement proposed by the league's board of governors Monday, each player will contribute \$500 a year toward a fund, with the club owners chipping in a similar sum for every member on their team.

Final Plans

Player representatives and a special pension committee of the board will meet on or about June 19 to formulate final plans for the fund.

The pension committee will be represented by owners Eddie Gottlieb of the Philadelphia Warriors, Walter Brown of the Boston Celtics, Fred Zollner of the Detroit Pistons and Dave Trager of the new Chicago Packers.

Richie Guerin of the New York Knickerbockers, Gene Shue of Detroit and Tommy Heinsohn of Boston were player representatives at Monday's meeting. Heinsohn was also elected president and eastern spokesman for the Players' association. Bob Pettit of the St. Louis Hawks was named vice president and western representative, while Shue was chosen treasurer.

The Board of Governors, after announcing that the 1962 All-Star game would be held in St. Louis on Tuesday night, Jan. 16, said that franchise bids from Baltimore and San Francisco airports will be heard at the current three-day session.
