Hypnosis May Be Cause of Some Mental Illness

Chicago (Science Service)—Hypnosis by an unqualified person can actually help cause mental illness.

What is believed to be the first case in medical-legal history in which hypnosis was accepted as contributory, although not entirely responsible, for mental illness was reported to the American Psychiatric Association meeting here by Dr. Bernard Tellet of Long Beach, Calif.

The case was that of a 45-year-old woman whose back was injured while she was working as a restaurant helper. When medicine and binders failed to help, she was referred to a neurologist. He recommended a course of hypnosis. She took a course of six hypnosis treatments. The therapist, although a professional person, was not a psychiatrist.

In this case there was unmistakable evidence of what psychiatrists call a schizoid personality—the kind of person who is withdrawn, seclusive, shut-in. The woman showed marked emotional detachment and fearfulness.

For the next nine months, the woman moved from one rooming house to another in rapid succession. She was trying to escape from persons who were "controlling her mind, hypnotizing her and attempting to harm her."

After the nine months of running, she had to be put in a hospital for treatment.

Individuals with schizoid type of personality development have an above-average chance of becoming mentally ill, Dr. Tellet told the psychiatrists. He warned them against using hypnosis with this kind of patient.

Dutch Engineers Supply Water to Caribbean Island

Oranjestad, Aruba—Water, water everywhere but not a drop to drink? was a familiar quotation which rang only too true to the mariner of old.

And for centuries the seas and the oceans defied men on land to partake of their waters.

But necessity to man became the undoing of nature's aim to conserve its resources. Only 30 years ago modern alchemists began to tap the sea for drinking water.

A water shortage developed on this arid, wind-blown island in the Caribbean many years after the Dutch conquered it in the 17th Century and repulsed British and French invaders.

Wells began to run dry and some water had to be brought in from other countries by ship, but this was not the solution. The sea itself was the only answer.

In 1930 Dutch engineers started a project to make salt water potable. They were unable to convert it in large quantities and inserted disks with small holes in the center into water pipes to prevent wastage by users.

Build Plant
Yet the Dutch felt they had made great inroads and in 1959 built a large plant that offers ample water to all residents of this westernmost island in the Netherlands Antilles.

"It is working very satisfactorily," Skelte Faber, head of the water plant, said in an interview. "We have problems of course, but we can take care of them."

Faber, a tall blond with piercing blue eyes and rugged jaw, explained the workings of the plant and then took this newsman on a tour of the five units which cost \$12 million to \$13 million to build.

Briefly, this is how sea water can be converted into drinking water. Salt water is poured into a boiler which makes steam. Some of the steam is blown into a generator to make enough electricity to serve the island. Part of the steam also goes through copper pipes which divert salt-free vapor into large vessels. The condensed pure vapor becomes pure water through lowering pressures as it goes through each vessel.

The plant just outside this capital city is the largest in the world. It will be expanded soon to meet the needs of new chemical industries which are intended to enrich the economy of Aruba.

Faber was philosophic about his country's accomplishment. "Now that the Russians have put a man in space I don't suppose anyone is particularly interested in America about our water problem," he said.

Faber was reassured, however, that the Russians proved only that the impossible can be made possible and the Dutch had done that many years ago.
