Gasoline Flushed - City firemen yesterday flushed down gasoline spills from three automobiles parked in the downtown area. They advised motorists against filling gasoline tanks too full at this time of year since the heat causes the gasoline to expand and overflow.

Firemen Inspect - Medford firemen yesterday inspected 101 dwellings in the city and made 51 recommendations for correction of hazards. No hazards were found in 63 residences. Eleven persons declined the offer of inspection. At 108 of the 220 houses at which firemen stopped no one was home.

Portland—(UPI)—Oregon continued to get sunshine today and the weather man predicted the good weather would last through the week end.

The long range outlook called for a few possible showers in western Oregon Monday or Tuesday. Week end temperatures probably will be a little cooler, though.

Medford had a high of 87 Thursday while Roseburg had 86, Portland 84, Salem and Eugene 82, The Dalles 81 and Astoria 79.
