At Least Three Marks Could Fall in District 6 A-1 Meet

Based on the best times among Southern Oregon conference athletes this season, at least three marks could tumble Saturday when the District 6 A-1 track meet is held at Ashland High school. The meet will have preliminaries starting at 10 a.m. and finals beginning at 2:30 p.m. Ashland, Crater, Klamath Union, Grants Pass and Medford will contend.

Standards most threatened are those for the 440-yard dash, the 880-yard relay and the half-mile. Medford's Bob McIntyre last week toured the quarter-mile in :49.2. District record is :49.6. The same afternoon the Tornado relay crew of McIntyre, Mike Hood, Kent Blew and Phil Humphreys ran in 1:28.5, which is 1.7 seconds faster than the record of 1:30.2.

Both Medford times are fastest reported in the state. In the half-mile Ken Marshall, Grants Pass, and Bob Rix, Medford, finished one-two in a race last week in the respective times of 2:00.5 and 2:00.7. The standard is 2:01.

Voris Equals
One other district mark has been equaled by Ashland's Bob Voris with :19.6 in the low hurdles.

Close battles for first and second spots and state meet berths seem likely in most of the events. In some contests there are strong favorites, although not one of the participants is immune to upset.

Medford's Hi Martin looks to be the favorite in the mile with the Tornadoes' Tom Bortis top contender in the shot put. Allen Phillips, Klamath Falls, should take the javelin. The Medford relay crew has by three seconds the best performance in that event.

McIntyre's 440 time is by .7 of a second tops but the Medfordite could be challenged by Grants Pass's Al Staley.

In the pole vault Dave Ricks and Jay Hughes of Grants Pass have the best marks at 12 feet 3 inches, but rivalry could be nip and tuck in the event. Ashland's Dave Colwell has gone one-half inch over 12 feet. Last Saturday Medford's Bill Charley tied with Grants Pass's Dan McIntyre for tops in a dual meet at 11-9 as both beat Hughes and Ricks. McIntyre has spent most of the school year recuperating from a knee injury.

Hurdles Contenders
In the high hurdles Bob Voris of Ashland, Hood and Walt Ayres of Medford, Ron Cowin of Grants Pass and John Champ of Crater are top contestants. In the lows it's among Voris, Gil Smith of Grants Pass, Hood and Andrews of Medford and Champ.

In the 100-yard dash Gary Wald and Jereal Brown of Crater, Humphreys and McIntyre of Medford have the best times and challengers include Charles Richey of Klamath Falls and Ray Meek and Fred Higgenbotham of Grants Pass. Richey, Wald and Humphreys are top 220 runners. Wald is a contender as are Meek and Mike Pilkington of GP.

Red Raiders To Vie at La Grande

Ashland—Southern Oregon's Red Raiders, rated a second place finisher behind strong and powerful Portland State, left Thursday for La Grande and the annual Oregon Collegiate conference track and field championships.

Also departing for La Grande with the Raider tracksters was Al Akins' SOC golf squad which will enter OCC competition on Saturday on the Eastern Oregon college campus.

Raider track coach Dan Bulky figures the Raiders to show up strong in the sprints and hurdles events, with the power-packed PSC Vikings grabbing off most of the other events.

"We're as ready as we'll ever be, with the exception of Bannister (Ora) and Hartman (Howard)," said Bulky as he left with his 25-man squad. Bannister, a sophomore quarter-miler from Paisley, Ore., suffered a pulled leg muscle in practice last Tuesday. Hartman, the Raiders' top hurdler and holder of the school record in the 180-yard highs with a 25-second flat clocking, has been troubled by a sore foot this past week.

"We hope that both will be ready by Saturday," commented Bulky prior to the trip.

Southern Oregon's hopes in the sprints rest with the fleet trio of Doyle Bransom, Kerm Bennett and Pat Conley. All three were clocked with 10-second flat centuries or better in last Friday's 103-28 bet over Oregon Tech. Bransom hit the tape in :9.9, Bennett was a close second in 9.9 and Conley was timed in 10 flat.

Akins' Raider golf crew is defending OCC champion and looks like all but a sure bet to repeat this season. The Raiders boast 15-0 and 11-1 wins over Oregon Tech and Oregon college in dual meet action this spring while also taking an 11-4 loss from University of Oregon last Friday.

Members of the Raider Links crew include senior captain Gordy Marlatt, runner-up in last spring's medalist play in the OCC, Phil Mongrain, Tony Lopez, Bob Jones and Dick Wood.

FROSH VICTORS
Eugene—UP—Oregon's crack freshman track team—with javelina ace Ron Gomez and miler Clayton Steinke turning in the top performances—walked the Oregon State Rooks 80-47 in a dual track meet here Thursday. Athletes from Lakeview and Myrtle Creek head the delegations. They are the champions, respectively, of the Rogue and Umpqua Valley league subdistrict tussles. Phoenix won the district title last year.

Four Marks in Danger
On the strength of the loop qualifying sessions only four district records seem in real danger. Those beating the district bests last Saturday were Jim Trimmer, Sutherlin, with :52 even in the 440-yard run, Bob Chapman, Henley, and Dave Kennedy, Illinois Valley with :15.4 and :15.5 in the high hurdles. Chapman with :21.1 in the low hurdles and Mike Consbruck, Phoenix, with 1:55-6 1/2 in the javelin.

Myrtle Creek with 12 has the most berths in the meet. Lakeview last week qualified for 11. Rogue River and Sutherlin each had 10, Phoenix nine and Douglas eight. Glendale has six, Henley and Illinois Valley each four, Oakland three, Riddle two and Glendale 1.
